SUBJECT: Notice of Changed Workshop Dates regarding Ameren Achieving Statutory Energy Savings Goals

DATE: April 17, 2019

The Illinois Commerce Commission's September 11, 2017 [Final Order](#) in ICC Docket No. 17-0311 ("Ameren EE Plan Order") directed the Staff of the Illinois Commerce Commission ("ICC Staff") to initiate a minimum of three workshops "involving Ameren Illinois and interested stakeholders to develop a path to achieving the [cumulative persisting annual savings goals] set out in the statute for future plans, with a focus on reduction of the cost/kWh in the Ameren Illinois service territory subject to the objectives and requirements of the Act."¹ The first workshop was held on March 29, 2019. Due to scheduling conflicts of the stakeholders wishing to present at the second workshop, the last two workshops have been rescheduled, the new dates and webinar information are presented on page 2 of this notice.

*Information Requested from Stakeholders Providing Recommendations at the
Ameren Illinois Commission Facilitated Workshops*

- 1) Proposal Description and how the proposal will assist Ameren Illinois in meeting statutory energy savings goals
- 2) Ameren Illinois program/initiative(s) the proposal impacts
- 3) For new program/measure ideas, how that program/measure compliments, competes with or would be different from current Ameren Illinois offerings
- 4) Description of the impacts of the proposal (for example, extent of increased savings, reduction in costs)
- 5) Any and all cost and savings information that has been determined related to the proposal, including but not limited to:
 - a) costs associated with the program/measure proposed; and
 - b) savings associated with the proposal including detail of the impact on CPAS
- 6) Discussion of any evaluation or regulatory risks associated with the implementation of the proposed program/measure
- 7) Please provide all relevant data including, but not limited to:
 - a) Assumptions and any data relied upon (costs, savings, etc.) in developing the proposal;
 - b) Include or identify any Ameren Illinois data relied upon; and
 - c) Spreadsheets (unlocked and working) developed and/or used in support of the proposal
- 8) Examples of the proposal working successfully in other markets, please include specifically as well:
 - a) which utilities have operated in that market,
 - b) an explanation of how and why that success would be transferrable and applicable to the Ameren Illinois service territory
- 9) Provide approximate timelines of when the program/measure could realistically be implemented, including allowing time for analysis, planning, contractor RFPs, and startup
- 10) Is the proposal vendor neutral? Please explain
- 11) Is the proposal manufacturer neutral, if recommending specific measure adoptions? Please explain.
- 12) Any additional information to assist with understanding the proposal being submitted
