**1. GENERAL**

1.1 Loops are only available to telecommunications carriers for use in the provision of a telecommunications service as specified and to the extent required by the Telecommunications Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-104, 110 Stat. 56 (1996) ("the Act"), the IL PUA, and the rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and the Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC). The Company intends that this tariff fully complies with the Company's obligations under the Illinois Public Utilities Act as amended effective June 30, 2001 ("Illinois PUA"). (T)

The Company has filed this tariff under compulsion of the Illinois Public Utilities Act, including as amended by Illinois Public Law 92-0222, and specifically reserves any and all rights and remedies it may have relating to possible challenges to Illinois Public Law 92-0222 and this tariff under state and federal law, including federal preemptive law.

1.2 This Section applies to Loops provided by the Company, hereafter referred to as the "Company". Loops are non-competitive telecommunications services which are offered in exchanges in Illinois as defined in Part 4, Section 1 of this Tariff. (T) (T)

1.3 General Regulations as found in Part 2 of this Tariff and Section 1 of this Part apply to this Section unless otherwise specified in this Section. The term "customer", which appears in Part 2 of the General Regulations, is the equivalent of the term "telecommunications carrier" as used in this Section.

1.5.1.1 In accordance with Section 13-409 of the Illinois PUA, during the first 2 years following the effective date (May 9, 2003) of Section 13-408, for the first 35,000 voice grade equivalent access lines used by a telecommunications carrier to provide local exchange service to end users, the monthly recurring rate for the unbundled network elements loop(s) associated with those lines and leased from an incumbent local exchange carrier to which Section 13-408 applies will be frozen at the levels in effect immediately prior to the effective date of Section 13-408 (see Rates and Charges - Paragraph 5.2 following). Thereafter, the monthly recurring rates for all unbundled network elements provided by any incumbent local exchange carrier to which Section 13-408 applies will be rates established by the Commission in accordance with the provisions of Section 13-408 (see Rates and Charges - Paragraph 5.1 following).

1.5.1.2 Unbundled loops used to provide Local Exchange Service over more than 35,000 voice grade equivalent access lines.

If, as of May 9, 2003, the effective date of Sections 13-408 and 13-409, an individual telecommunications carrier uses unbundled network elements leased from a specific incumbent local exchange carrier to provide local exchange service over more than 35,000 voice grade equivalent access lines, that carrier must designate the 35,000 voice grade equivalent access lines to which the provisions of subsections (a) and (b) of Section 13-409 as set forth in Paragraph 1.5.1.1 above apply. If subsequent to such designation, the individual carrier loses the customer served by a designated access line, and therefore no longer leases the unbundled network elements associated with that line, the individual carrier may not designate a different access line to substitute for the lost line. All unbundled network elements leased to provide service over undesignated voice grade equivalent access lines shall be subject to the full monthly recurring rates established by the Commission in accordance with the provisions of Section 13-408 (see Rates and Charges - Paragraph 5.1 following).

1.5.1.3 Unbundled Loops used to provide Local Exchange Service over fewer than 35,000 voice grade equivalent access lines.

If, as of May 9, 2003, the effective date of Sections 13-408 and 13-409, an individual carrier uses unbundled network elements leased from a specific local exchange carrier to provide local exchange service over fewer than 35,000 voice grade equivalent access lines, that carrier must designate the access lines to which the provisions of subsections (a) and (b) of Section 13-409, as set forth in Paragraph 1.5.1.1 above, apply. If subsequent to such designation, the individual carrier loses the customer served by a designated access line, and therefore no longer leases the unbundled network elements associated with that line, the individual carrier may not designate a different access line to substitute for the lost line. Subject to these limitations, subsequent to the effective date of Section 13-409, such a carrier may designate additional voice grade equivalent access lines to which it wishes the provisions of subsections (a) and (b) of Section 13-409 to apply, until the total designated lines equal 35,000. If a subsequently designated line is lost, the carrier will not be permitted to designate a different line to substitute for that lost line. All unbundled network elements leased to provide service over undesignated voice grade equivalent access lines shall be subject to the full monthly recurring rates established by the Commission in accordance with the provisions of Section 13-408 (see Rates and Charges - Paragraph 5.1 following).

**1. GENERAL (cont'd)**

Telecommunications carriers wishing to engage in Line Splitting may request that an existing UNE-P be converted to stand-alone unbundled network elements (UNEs) that the telecommunications carrier uses with the telecommunications carrier's splitter (or a splitter provided by another telecommunications carrier in a voluntary line splitting arrangement) to provide both voice and data over a single copper loop. This is a rearrangement of the loop and port involved. This requires the Company to disconnect the UNE-P and to install the connections for each UNE (xDSL-capable loop and ULS-ST port) to a collocation arrangement to reach the splitter. The Company will attempt to reuse the existing loop where it is xDSL-capable. Telecommunications carrier is responsible for performing loop qualification prior to submitting the LSR to determine if the loop is xDSL capable.

The Company technician will work related orders concurrently to 1) install a new cross-connect for the ULS-ST port to the designated collocation arrangement, 2) install a new cross-connect for the xDSL capable loop to the designated collocation arrangement and 3) disassemble the UNE-P. This process creates a minimal amount of downtime for the end-user.

The telecommunications carrier should perform cross-connects inside their collocation cage to pre-wire their splitter and provide accurate CFA information on the LSR, meaning not a defective pair or pair already in use. Connectivity will then be achieved between the telecommunications carrier equipment and the xDSL capable loop and ULS-ST port to the collocation arrangement. If the telecommunications carrier does not have the splitter pre-wired or the CFA provided is incorrect, dial tone will not leave the Central Office. In this case, the Company technician is to place the order into jeopardy and wire the customer back to UNE-P.

While the Company technician is running cross-connects to the telecommunications carriers designated point in the collocation space, end users may notice a minimal amount of downtime which, on average and under normal circumstances, should not exceed 15 minutes.

1.8 Liability

- A. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, each Party, whether a CLEC or the Company, agrees that should it cause any non-standard xDSL technologies to be deployed or used in connection with or on the Company facilities, the Party ("Indemnifying Party") will pay all costs associated with any damage, service interruption or other telecommunications service degradation, or damage to the other Party's ("Indemnitee") facilities. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, each Party ("Indemnifying Party") shall release, defend and indemnify the other Party ("Indemnitee") and hold Indemnitee harmless against any Loss or claim made by the Indemnifying Party's end-user arising out of the negligence or willful misconduct of the Indemnitee, its agents, its end users, contractors, or others retained by such Party, in connection with Indemnitee's provision of splitter functionality under this Section.
- B. For any technology, CLEC's use of any Company network element, or its own equipment or facilities in conjunction with any Company network element, will not materially interfere with or impair service over any facilities of the Company, its affiliated companies or connecting and concurring carriers involved in the Company services, cause damage to the Company's plant, impair the privacy of a communications carried over the Company's facilities or create hazards to employees or the public. Upon reasonable written notice and after a reasonable opportunity to cure, the Company may discontinue or refuse service if CLEC violates this provision, provided that such termination of service will be limited to CLEC's use of the element(s) causing the violation. The Company will not disconnect the elements causing the violation if, after receipt of written notice and opportunity to cure, the CLEC demonstrates that their use of the network element is not the cause of the network harm. Any claims of network harm by the Company must be supported with specific and verifiable supporting information. (T)

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Indemnifying Party will consult with Indemnitee on the selection of defense counsel and consider any applicable conflicts of interest. Indemnifying Party is required to assume all costs of the defense and any damages resulting from the use of any non-standard xDSL technologies in connection with or on Indemnitee's facilities or Indemnifying Party's provision of splitter functionality under this Section.

- C. Indemnitee agrees to fully cooperate with the defense of any Covered Claim. Indemnitee will provide written notice to Indemnifying Party of any Covered Claim at the address for notice assigned herein within ten days of receipt, and, in the case of receipt of service of process, will deliver such process to Indemnifying Party not later than 10 business days prior to the date for response to the process. Indemnitee will provide to Indemnifying Party reasonable access to or copies of any relevant physical and electronic documents or records related to the deployment of non-standard xDSL technologies used by Indemnitee in the area affected by the claim, or Indemnifying Party's provision of splitter functionality under this Section, all other documents or records determined to be discoverable, and all other relevant documents or records that defense counsel may reasonably request in preparation and defense of the Covered Claim. Indemnitee will further cooperate with Indemnifying Party's investigation and defense of the Covered Claim by responding to the reasonable requests to make its employees with knowledge relevant to the Covered Claim available as witnesses for preparation and participation in discovery and trial during regular weekday business hours. Indemnitee will promptly notify Indemnifying Party of any settlement communications, offers or proposals received from claimants.
- D. Indemnitee agrees that Indemnifying Party will have no indemnity obligation under 1.9A above, and Indemnitee will reimburse Indemnifying Party's defense costs, in any case in which Indemnifying Party's technology is determined not to be the cause of any Indemnitee liability and in any case in which Indemnifying Party's provision of splitter functionality under this Section is determined not to be the cause of any Indemnitee liability.
- E. Claims Not Covered: No Party hereunder agrees to indemnify or defend any other Party against claims based on the other Party's gross negligence or intentional misconduct.

2.3 Ordering and Provisioning

The Company will provide telecommunications carriers with electronic access to place service orders for Loops. Application of service order types and applicable rates are shown in 4. and 5. following. (T)

A. Loops

The Company will provide access to its unbundled loops at each Company wire center via Collocation as described in Part 23, Section 4 of this tariff. Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, Collocation will not be required for the provision of currently combined Unbundled Local Switching with Shared Transport and Unbundled Local Loops obtained through Section 15 of this Part, Provision of Existing Combinations of Network Elements. Any other access to unbundled loops can be requested via the Bona Fide Request Process. (T)

The Cross Connect Charge, shown in 5. following, is applicable when a loop is cross-connected to transport provided by the telecommunications carrier or a third party.

2.4 NID to NID Interconnection

Where the telecommunications carrier desires access to the Network Interface Device (NID) so that it may gain access to an end user customer's inside wire, the Company will permit the telecommunications carrier to connect the telecommunications carrier's own loop to the inside wiring of the end user customer's premises through the Company NID. The telecommunications carrier must establish the connection through an adjoining telecommunications provider's NID which serves as the Network Interface (NI) or demarcation for its loop. 2.5 Operational Support Systems: Loop Make-Up Information

The Company will provide CLEC with nondiscriminatory access that is available by electronic or manual means, to its loop make-up information set forth in the Plans of Record.<sup>/1/</sup> In the interim, loop make-up data will be provided as set forth below. In accordance with the FCC's UNE Remand Order, CLEC will be given nondiscriminatory access to the same loop make-up information that the Company is providing any other CLEC and/or the Company or its advanced services affiliate.

- A. Loop Qualification: The Company will develop and deploy enhancements to its existing EDI interfaces that will allow CLECs, including the Company's advanced services affiliate, as well as the Company's retail operations, to have near real-time electronic access as a pre-ordering function to the loop makeup information.

Electronic access to loop data through OSS enhancements described above will return information in all fields described in the Plans of Record where information is contained in the Company's electronic databases. If manual loop qualification is requested, loop makeup data will include the following: (a) the actual loop length; (b) the length by gauge; and (c) the presence of repeaters, load coils, or bridged taps; and shall include, if noted on the individual loop record, (d) the total length of bridged taps, load coils, and repeaters; (e) the presence of pair gain devices, DLC, and/or DAML, and (f) the presence of disturbers in the same and/or adjacent binder groups to the extent such information exists in the Company's databases. If a detailed manual loop qualification is requested, loop makeup data should include all of the fields described in the Plans of Record including those described above for manual loop qualification.

- B. Loop make-up information (loop qualification) will be provided subject to the following:
  - 1. If a CLEC elects to have the Company provide loop makeup through a manual process for information not available electronically, then the loop qualification interval will be 3-5 business days, or the interval provided to the Company's affiliate, whichever is less. Such manual loop qualification shall be provided on a time and materials basis at rates set forth in 5.7 below.
  - 2. If the results of the loop qualification indicate that conditioning is available, CLEC may request that the Company perform conditioning at charges set forth in 5.8 below. The CLEC may order the loop without conditioning or with partial conditioning if desired.

2.6 Spectrum Inventory Guidelines

CLEC must advise the Company of the PSD mask approved or proposed by T1.E1 that reflects the service performance parameters of the technology to be deployed over the xDSL loop. The CLEC, at its option, may provide any service compliant with that PSD mask so long as it stays within the allowed service performance parameters. At the time of ordering an xDSL loop, CLEC will notify the Company as to the type of PSD mask CLEC intends to use on the ordering form, and if and when a change in PSD mask is made, CLEC will notify the Company. CLEC will abide by standards pertinent for the designated PSD mask type. If the technology does not have a PSD mask, CLEC shall provide the Company with a technical description of the technology (including power mask) for inventory purposes. (T)

- A. In the event that the FCC or the industry establishes long-term standards and practices and policies relating to spectrum compatibility and spectrum management that differ from those established in this Tariff, the Company and CLEC agree to comply with the FCC and/or industry standards, practices and policies. The Company will work with CLECs to establish a transition plan and timeframe for achieving and implementing such industry standards, practices and policies.
- B. Within thirty (30) days after general availability of equipment conforming to applicable industry standards or the mutually agreed upon standards developed by the industry in conjunction with the Commission or FCC, the Company and/or CLEC must begin the process of bringing its deployed xDSL technologies and equipment into compliance with such standards at its own expense. **3. SERVICE DESCRIPTION**

3.1 Loops

A loop consists of a transmission path furnished by the Company between its Network Interface Device (NID) located at the telecommunications carrier's end user's premises and the main distributing frame (or other designated Company frame) in a Company central office, unbundled from local switching or other services. Loops are defined by the electrical interface rather than the type of facility used.

The transmission parameters associated with the types of loops below are contained in the Ameritech Technical References listed in Service Parameters preceding.

3.2 Analog Loops

- A. A 2-wire Analog Interface Loop facilitates transmission of voice grade signals and terminates in a 2-wire electrical interface at the telecommunications carrier's end user's premises and a 2-wire electrical interface at the Company central office frame.
- B. A 4-wire Analog Interface Loop facilitates transmission of voice grade signals using separate transmit and receive paths and terminates in a 4-wire electrical interface at the telecommunications carrier's end user's premises and a 4-wire electrical interface at the Company central office frame.

- D. A 2-wire 640 Kbps ADSL Compatible Loop facilitates transmission of digital signals and terminates in a 2-wire electrical interface at both the telecommunications carrier's end user's premises and the frame in the Company central office.
- E. A 2-wire 768 Kbps HDSL Compatible Loop facilitates transmission of digital signals and terminates in a 2-wire electrical interface at both the telecommunications carrier's end user's premises and the frame in the Company central office.
- F. A 4-wire 1.544 Mbps (DS1) HDSL Compatible Loop facilitates transmission of digital signals at 1.544 Mbps and terminates in a 4-wire electrical interface at both the telecommunications carrier's end user's premises and the frame in the Company central office.
- G. A DS3 unbundled loop provides a digital 45 Mbps transmission facility from the telecommunications carrier's end user's premises to the frame in the Company central office.

3.4 Service Coordination Fee

A Service Coordination Fee is a monthly rate element applicable to each telecommunication carrier ordering a loop(s) on a per bill, per central office basis.

4.1 Unbundled Loop Rates and Charges:

Rates and charges for unbundled loops are applied on an individual loop basis.

4.2 Service Charges: Analog or 2-Wire Digital Loops, and xDSL-Capable Loops (T)

A. Service Order Charges

Service Order Nonrecurring Charges apply for the receiving, recording and processing of information necessary to execute a telecommunications carrier's request for installation, disconnection, and subsequent activity. Unless otherwise specified, the appropriate Service Order Charge is in addition to any other nonrecurring charge that may be applied for the equipment or service furnished.

Service Order Initial Charge

The Initial Service Order Charge is applicable when analog or 2-wire digital loops and xDSL-capable loops. One charge per order. A separate order is required per telecommunications carrier's end user location and/or loop type requested. (T)

Service Order Subsequent Charge

This charge is applicable when adding or changing service on an existing analog or 2-wire digital loop and xDSL-capable loops. One charge applies per order. A separate order is required per telecommunications carrier's end user location and/or loop type involved. (T)

Record Work Charge

This charge applies to a subsequent request that involves only record activity. A separate order is required per telecommunications carrier's end user location and/or loop type involved.

4.3 Digital Loops

Nonrecurring Charges

Nonrecurring charges are one-time charges that apply for specific work activity (i.e., installation of elements or rearrangement of installed elements). The nonrecurring charges that apply for DS1 and DS3 Loops are as follows:

Administrative Charge - applies when a telecommunications carrier initiates an order for installation or rearrangement of installed elements. This charge applies per carrier order regardless of the number of digital loops on the order.

Service Order Provisioning Charge - applies when a telecommunications carrier's initiated order requires engineering design and/or installation or change at the Company wire center and/or installation or change at the telecommunications carrier's end-user location. This charge applies per digital loop on the order.

4.4 Ameritech Cross-Connection Service

Ameritech Cross-Connection Service rates are applicable when loops are provisioned to be cross-connected to transmission equipment and/or transport provided by the telecommunications carrier or a third party and is applied per loop cross-connected based on the type of interface (2-wire or 4-wire, etc.).
