CALL HANDLING (Exhibit 8)

Franklin County PSAP Center receiving a call for emergency services in your jurisdiction shall dispatch the call in the following manner:

Primary: 9-1-1 calls will be dispatched via radio on frequency 158.895 to the Benton Police Department.

Secondary: 9-1-1 calls will be dispatched via radio on frequency 154.995 to the Benton Police Department.

AID OUTSIDE JURISDICTION BOUNDARY (Exhibit 9)

Once and emergency unit is dispatched in response to a request through the system, such unit shall render its service to the requesting party without regard to whether the unit is operating outside its normal jurisdictional boundaries.

The legislative intent is that 9-1-1 be used for emergency calls only. Therefore, all calls of an administrative or non-emergency nature shall be referred to your agency's published telephone number.

The PSAP Center agrees to keep all records, times, and places of all calls. All records will be available to all participants of the 9-1-1 System.

It shall be the responsibility of you agency to maintain the report of the call and the disposition of each call received.

Primary: 9-1-1 calls will be relayed via telephone (618) 435-3220 through West City Police Department to West City Fire Department.

Secondary: 9-1-1 calls will be relayed via radio frequency 154.725 through West City Police Department to West City Fire Department.

Once and emergency unit is dispatched in response to a request through the system, such unit shall render its service to the requesting party without regard to whether the unit is operating outside its normal jurisdictional boundaries.
