

Dear Mr. Greenan:

Please refer to our correspondence of 11 December 1991 regarding the above application.

Be advised that subsequent to that date, direct trunk transfer, with ANI/ALI and voice, has been provided by Southwest Central for service calls for the Tri-State Fire Protection District originating in the Village of Willowbrook. This transfer method is in line with our agreement signed with the Dupage County ETSB, and it is our understanding that no subsequent contract is required between Tri-State and Southwest Central.

As our sole objection to the application was to insure direct trunk transfer from that portion of the Village of Willowbrook serviced by Tri-State FPD, and as that service has been installed and is operational at this time, we hereby withdraw our objection to the application.





CONTRACT BETWEEN THE SOUTHWEST CENTRAL 9-1-1 SYSTEM
AND THE DUPAGE COUNTY EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM
BOARD FOR ENHANCED 9-1-1 EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SERVICE

WHEREAS, Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 134, Paragraph 45.3, provides that municipalities and counties are authorized to pass an ordinance to impose a monthly surcharge imposed on billed subscribers of network connection provided by telecommunication carriers engaged in the business of transmitting messages by means of electricity originating within the corporate limits of any municipality or county for the purpose of installing or improving a 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone Service; and,

WHEREAS, the majority of voters of the County of DuPage approved the question on April 4, 1989, to allow the residents within the corporate boundaries of the County of DuPage, to impose a monthly surcharge on billed subscribers of network connection provided by telecommunication carriers for purposes of installing or improving a 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone Service; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the April 4, 1989, referendum, the County of DuPage has collected the 50 cent monthly surcharge imposed on billed subscribers of network connection provided by telecommunication carriers from the residents of the County of DuPage commencing November 1, 1989.

WHEREAS, the Village of Willowbrook is a member of the DuPage County Emergency Telephone System Board and Southwest Central Dispatch, an intergovernmental association; and

WHEREAS, the Southwest Central 9-1-1 System and the County of DuPage have determined that there presently exists a need for installing or improving the 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone System which will serve all the residents within the Village of Willowbrook; and

WHEREAS, the DuPage County Emergency Telephone System Board is desirous of obtaining E-9-1-1 emergency dispatch service from the Southwest Central 9-1-1 System on behalf of the Village of Willowbrook.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Chairman of the DuPage County Emergency Telephone System Board is hereby authorized to enter into the Contract (attached hereto and made a part hereof); and
