2.3.4.2 Additional Line Services (Cont'd.)

2.3.4.2.2 Additional Residential Line Service

Additional residential local exchange access lines include no usage, yet include Caller ID with name and one additional central office feature as described in Section 2.3.7. Additional residential lines shall share minutes of Intra-LATA and/or Inter-LATA Intra-State use with its Primary Line(s) where applicable. Should a customer with additional residential lines opt to disconnect its last Primary Line, one of the remaining additional residential lines will be changed to a Primary Line at the Primary Line monthly recurring rate.

The Company offers an Additional Residential Access Line where customer rates (see Section 2.3.5.2.2) vary based on whether the customer's location is in Access Area A, B, or C. The Additional Residential Access Line includes no Intra-LATA minutes of use. The Additional Residential Access Line may not be used on a stand-alone basis or with the Economy Line 100 Plan. The Additional Residential Access Line may be used with the Primary Line – Residential – Basic (grandfathered), Primary Line – Residential – Unlimited Intra-LATA, Primary Line – Residential – Combined Unlimited Intra-LATA and Inter-LATA Intra-State, or the Economy 210 Residential Plans. Where the Additional Residential Access Lines is so used, it may share usage with the applied for plan.

2.3.4 Access Service (Cont'd.)

2.3.4.3 Economy Plans

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Economy Plans are special offers for business and residential customers. Economy Plans do not require a Primary Line. Multi-line Economy Plans share Intra-LATA minutes of use between lines. Features and Intra-LATA minutes of use may vary by plan. Economy Plans are only available at a single address.

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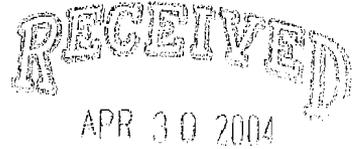

2.3.4.3 Economy Plans (Cont'd.)

2.3.4.3.1 Economy Line 100 Plan

All single line economy plans are available only for residential service. The Economy Line 100 Plan includes one line including Caller ID with name and one additional central office feature as described in section 2.3.7. The Economy Line 100 Plan includes no Intra-LATA minutes of use. A residential customer may have any combination of lines, either Primary or Economy Line 100 Plan. The Economy Line 100 Plan has been grandfathered. The Company now offers the Economy Access 100 Plan where customer rates (see Section 2.3.5.3) vary based on whether the customer's location is in Access Area A, B, or C. The Economy Access 100 Plan is available for business and residential service. Both plans include one line including Caller ID with name and one additional central office feature as described in Section 2.3.7, and include no Intra-LATA minutes of use. Intra-LATA use is billed as outlined in Section 2.4.2.1. A customer may order more than one Economy Residential Access 100 Plan line at a single location, but Economy Residential Access 100 Plan lines may not be ordered in combination with any other residential offerings. The Economy Business Access 100 Plan may only be used on a stand-alone basis.



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2.3.4.3.2 Economy 210 Plan

Economy 210 Plan includes two lines. Both can have Caller ID with name and one additional feature and one line may have all available central office features as described in Section 2.3.7. Both lines shall share 1,000 minutes of Intra-LATA usage. Economy 210 Plan is available for business and residential services. Only one Economy 210 Plan may be ordered for a single business or residential location and may not be combined with any other Data Net Systems lines. The Economy 210 Plan has been grandfathered. The Company offers the Economy 210 Access Plan where customer rates (see Section 2.3.5.3) vary based on whether the customer's location is in Access Area A, B, or C. Both plan lines can have Caller ID with name and one additional feature and one line may have all available central office features as described in Section 2.3.7. Both lines shall share 1,000 minutes of Intra-LATA usage. The Economy 210 Access Plan is available for business and residential services. Only one Economy 210 Access Plan may be ordered for a single business or residential location. The Economy 210 Access Plan may only be combined with Additional Business Access Lines or Additional Residential Access Lines respectively. These plans are not available for basic COPTS or COPTS Coin line service.

2.3.5 Access Service – Rate Schedule

Rates for Exchange Access Services are based upon "Class of Service" (as set forth in this tariff's "Definitions" section). All rates in this section are applied monthly unless specifically identified otherwise.

* This recurring charge is necessary to meet the Company's expense for an SBC demand to escrow an SBC retroactive amount of \$1.06 per COPTS port between February 6, 2003 and December 23, 2003, for the Flex ANI charge approved by the Commission order in Docket No. 01-0609 dated October 22, 2003. The Company is contesting the retroactive charges but have been required by SBC to escrow the amount SBC had demanded. This is a temporary charge. A favorable decision from the Commission will result in customer payments of this charge being credited to the customer's account.

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2.3 Exchange Access Service (Cont'd.)

2.3.6 Additional Charges Applied to Exchange Access Services

In addition to the charges for Basic Exchange Access Services described in Section 2.3.5 preceding, the following charges apply to each individual Exchange Access Service line unless otherwise specified:

- (a) The 911 telecommunications Service Surcharge
- (b) Universal Service Fund Charge
- (c) Any applicable municipal, state or federal taxes, franchise fees or other charges.
- (d) Casual traffic charges that are derived from third party calls (e.g., 10XXX, 900/976, third party calls initiated by Customer through Data Net Systems L.L.C.'s system) and trafficked over Data Net Systems L.L.C.'s system.
- (e) Service Provider Number Portability (SPNP) monthly charges – As provided for in Illinois Bell Telephone Company's tariff ILL. CC. No. 20, Part 4 Section 2.
- (f) ITAC Supplemental Charge – As provided for in Illinois Bell Telephone Company's tariff ILL. CC. No. 20, Part 8, Section 6. DNS will not reflect this as a separate charge on its Customer's bills.

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2.3 Exchange Access Service (Cont'd.)

2.3.7 Central Office Features

The following features are available, dependant upon the capabilities of the specific switch.

Feature Descriptions

Call Waiting – Provides a tone signal when a second call is coming in on a busy line. This feature is not compatible with Busy Line Transfer as provided in Section 3 of this PART, Paragraph 2.A(1).

Call Forwarding – Permits a customer to have all incoming calls to line automatically transferred to another dialable telephone number.

The following Call Forwarding Services are offered:

Call Forwarding-Variable: a customer activated feature that automatically transfers all incoming calls to the customer's telephone number to another dialable telephone number until the customer deactivates the feature. If transferred to a number served by the same or a different central office switch, multiple calls will be transferred simultaneously provided that there are sufficient facilities to accept the calls.

Where a charge (local or long distance) is applicable for a call between the customer's telephone and the telephone to which calls are to be forwarded, such charge (dial station-to-station rate) is billed to the customer on every call forwarded to and answered at that telephone.

Threeway Calling* - permits adding a third party to an established connection without Company operator assistance.

Speed Calling – permits a customer to call other telephone numbers by dialing a code rather than the complete telephone number. The repertory list for such telephone numbers is available in an 8 or 30 number capacity.

*The grade of transmission on calls forwarded or on threeway calls may vary depending on the distance and routing necessary to complete the call. Therefore, the normal grade end-to-end transmission is not guaranteed on such calls.

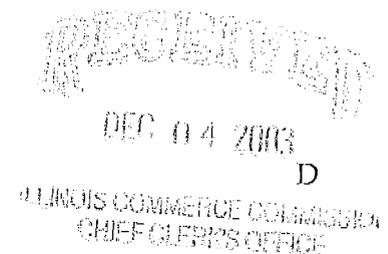
2.3.7 Central Office Features (Cont'd.)

Caller ID – For each customer line on which Carrier sells Caller ID, displays incoming number on a Customer provided display device attached to line or telephone or answering machine with a built in screen.

Caller ID with Name – For each customer line on which Carrier sells Caller ID with Name, must subscribe to Caller ID. Displays the listed name associated with the number on the Customer provided device.

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2.4 Usage Service

2.4.1 General

Local usage services provide Customers subscribing to the Company's Exchange Access Service, the ability to place calls to and receive calls from parties located in the Company's Local Usage Service Area described in Section 2.4.2.

Inter-LATA, Intra-State usage services provide customers, subscribing to the Company's Exchange Access Service, the ability to place calls to and receive calls from parties exchanges located outside of the LATA and within the State.

2.4.2 Local Usage Service Area

The Company's Local Usage Service Area is separated into three distinct rate categories or "rate bands," all encompassed within MSA 1. Local Usage Services are grouped into three rate bands defined as Rate Bands A, B, and C. Rate bands A, B, and C define the approximate mileage of the call, with Band A calls being calls of the shortest distance and Band C calls being the longest distance. Any local call made from an exchange within which the Company provides Exchange Access Services to another exchange within which the Company provides Exchange Access Service will be rated as either Band A, B, or C. Usage charges vary by band, time of day, and duration for all calls. Usage bands (A, B, and C) are listed by originating district in SBC/Ameritech ILL C.C. No. 20, PART 4, Section 2, Paragraph 4.4 (G).

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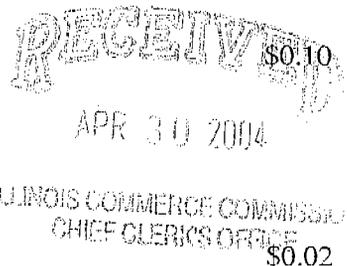

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2.4 Usage Service (Cont'd.)

2.4.4 Inter-LATA Intra-State Usage Service Area

Inter-LATA Intra-State Usage Service Area includes all exchanges within the State and outside of the Company's Exchange Access Service Area's LATA. Any Inter-LATA Intra-State calls made from an exchange within which the Company provides Exchange Access Service to another exchange not in the same LATA but within the State will be billed in minutes of use. An Inter-LATA Intra-State toll-only rate is available for residential and business when a Primary Line is not provided by the Company.

2.4.5 Calling Cards

Toll Free Access Cards are available for Customers presubscribed through local and long distance plans to place calls when away from home. A toll free access number is provided as a travel option. Calls are billed in sixty (60) second increments with an initial period, for billing purposes, of sixty seconds. This service is offered on a month-to-month basis. No minimum commitment is required. A payphone surcharge applies to calls made from payphones to the toll free number.

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2.5 Operator Assistance and Payphone Surcharges

2.5.1 General

Operator Assistance Surcharges apply when a Customer utilizes either an automated or live Company-provided operator for purposes of completing or billing a call. Operator Assistance Surcharges apply in addition to either local usage or long-distance usage services as identified in this tariff Section 2.4.3. Payphone surcharges apply when a toll free call or operator assisted call is made from a Payphone and billed to a customer's line.

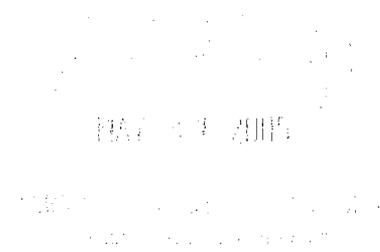
