PROPOSED ORDER

By the Commission:

On March 22, 2006, the Illinois Commerce Commission (“Commission”) entered an Order in this docket citing CM Tel (USA) LLC (“Respondents”) for failure to maintain corporate status. The order cited the Certificate of Revocation from the Illinois Secretary of State and sent to the Chief Clerk of the Commission and recounted that the Respondent had failed to file its 2004 Annual Report, as required by the provisions of the Illinois Limited Liability Company Act. This matter came on for hearing before a duly authorized Administrative Law Judge at the offices of the Commission in Springfield on June 14, 2006. Counsel for the Commission Staff entered an appearance. No appearance was entered on behalf of Respondent.

Counsel for Staff recommended that the certificate previously granted to Respondent be revoked since Respondents had failed to maintain corporate status. At the end of the hearing, the record was marked “Heard and Taken.” A Proposed Order was served on Respondent and Staff. No briefs on exceptions were filed.

The Commission, having reviewed the entire record and being fully advised in the premises, is of the opinion and finds that the certificate granted to Respondent should be cancelled and revoked.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Illinois Commerce Commission that the certificate of service authority granted to CM Tel (USA) LLC is hereby cancelled and revoked.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that resolution of this citation proceeding does not relieve Respondent from the requirements of the Public Utilities Act to file annual reports or to pay any penalty for failure to do so.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that subject to the provisions of Section 10-113 of the Public Utilities Act and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 200.880, this Order is final; it is not subject to the Administrative Review Law.
