Schedule of Rates Process for Proposed Orders under 220 ILCS/5/13-801(i)

The purpose of this section is to inform telecommunications carriers of the single point of contact and the process for the Company to provide a schedule of rates that pertains to a proposed order identified for the matters covered by 220 ILCS 5/801.

Requests made under that statute to the Company should be received via fax between the hours of 7:00 a.m. Central time and 6:00 p.m. on business days at:

For any request, the carrier must submit the following information, at a minimum, typed:

- Service type (UNE, Access)
- A designation that the rate schedule be based on Tariff rates or the rate schedule from the telecommunications carrier's interconnection agreement
- For UNE Requests
 - UNE loop functionality type (xDSL, 2W, 4W, Analog, Digital, etc.) (D)
 - End-User Address (D)
 - Collocation
- Ancillary Services (E911, etc.) (D)

Also include a return fax number to which the Company can send a response and any other written communications about your request, and the name and telephone number of a contact who can provide additional information and otherwise discuss the request.

A Company single point of contact and the particular manner by which such requests are made is necessary to provide the Company with a reasonable opportunity to respond within the two(2) business day objective. Failure to send a request in this manner, or if the proposed order is incomplete, unclear, or illegible, may prevent the Company from responding promptly or accurately. The date that the request is received will not be counted in calculating the response time.

B. TERMS AND CONDITIONS (cont'd)

Branding

Telecommunications carriers may not, without the Company's written authorization, offer Unbundled Network Elements under any of the brand names of the Company or any of its affiliates, nor may any telecommunications carrier state or imply that there is any joint business association or any similar arrangement with the Company in the provision of telecommunications services to the telecommunications carrier's end-users. Company may brand services under this Part with its own brand name but will not provide for telecommunications carrier branding of those services. (D)

Use of Service

Unlawful Use of Service

Service shall not be used for any purpose in violation of law. The telecommunications carrier, and not the Company, shall be responsible to ensure that telecommunications carrier and its end-users' use of the services provided hereunder complies at all times with all applicable laws. The Company may refuse to furnish service to a telecommunications carrier applicant or shall disconnect the service of a telecommunications carrier or as appropriate the telecommunications carrier's end-user when:

- An order is issued by a court, the Illinois Commerce Commission or any other duly authorized agency, finding that probable cause exists to believe that the use made or to be made of the service is prohibited by law, or
- The Company is notified in writing by a Law Enforcement Agency acting within its jurisdiction that any facility furnished by the Company is being used or will be used for the purpose of transmitting or receiving gambling information in interstate or foreign commerce in violation of law.



- Unbundled Interoffice Transport

Unbundled Interoffice Transport provided to telecommunications carriers are ordered on a per facility basis. Unbundled Interoffice Transport is ordered using the standard procedures currently used by interexchange carriers for ordering special access high capacity transport. These procedures are described in Section 5.2 of Ill. C.C. NO. 21.

A telecommunications carrier may order any number of Unbundled Interoffice Transport network elements of the same type and between the same locations in a single Access Order. All details concerning Unbundled Interoffice Transport network elements for a particular order must be identical. All network elements on an Access Order must have the same carrier requested service date.

For Unbundled Interoffice Transport the telecommunications carrier must specify the central offices, the type of service (e.g., DS1), the channel interface, the technical specification package and options desired. (C)

Types of Rates and Charges (cont'd)

Rate Zones

Rate zones are applicable to DS1 (1.544 Mbps) and DS3 (44.736 Mbps) facilities. Each Company central office has been assigned to a rate zone as described in Section 7.7 of Tariff F.C.C. No. 2. Interoffice Mileage and Interoffice Mileage Termination rates are dependent upon the zone assignment of the central office. Interoffice mileage that is computed between central offices in different rate zones will be assessed the rates in the higher rate zone. Multiplexing rates will be determined by the location of the multiplexing arrangement. (C)

Mileage Measurement

The mileage to be used to determine the Interoffice Mileage charges is calculated on the airline distance, using the V&H coordinates method. This method is set forth in the Exchange Carrier Association Tariff F.C.C. No. 4 for Wire Center Information (V&H coordinates). To determine the amount to be billed, first compute the mileage using the V&H coordinates method. If the calculation results in a fraction of a mile, round up to the next whole mile.

Ordering Conditions

A telecommunications carrier may order any number of Unbundled Interoffice Transport network elements of the same type and between the same locations in a single order. All details concerning Unbundled Interoffice Transport network elements for a particular order must be identical. All network elements on an order must have the same carrier requested service date.

The telecommunications carrier shall provide all information necessary for the Company to provide and bill for the requested service.

Service Description (cont'd)

Ameritech Illinois will condition xDSL sub-loops, as required by FCC 99-238, at the request of the telecommunications carrier so as to allow the requesting carrier to offer advanced services. This "conditioning" consists of the removal of bridge taps, repeaters, and load coils. As a result, sub-loop conditioning will be performed upon request for telecommunications carriers ordering xDSL sub-loops, subject to the terms and conditions herein.

Ameritech Illinois will consider, pursuant to the BFR process, telecommunications carrier requests to obtain access at points in Ameritech Illinois's network other than those identified herein, where such access may be technically feasible.

This Section contains a schedule of rates and regulations applicable to access to dark fiber. Currently the following types of dark fibers are available.

Dark Fiber Interoffice Transport

(D)

Telecommunications carriers will be able to obtain access to dark fiber from the Company where such facilities exist regardless of the date the fiber optic cable was deployed. The Company is not required to construct additional dark fiber facilities as a result of a request for access to unbundled dark fiber service request.

Service Description

Dark Fiber is deployed unlit fiber optic cable that connects two points within the Company's network. Dark Fiber is spare fiber that has not been activated through connection to the electronics that "light" that fiber, and thereby rendering it capable of carrying telecommunications services. Spare dark fiber is fiber that is spliced in all segments from end to end and would provide continuity or "light" end to end. The Company will place cross-connects between existing segments to make dark fiber available end to end.

Access to dark fiber is to be used to provide telecommunications carriers with the ability to provide local telephone exchange service to the telecommunications carrier's end user customers. Dark fiber is not permitted to be used for displacing the Company's existing tariffed access services except to the extent required by law.

3. Demarcation Points

The demarcation point for dark fiber at central offices will be in a Company-approved 90/10 splitter shelf. This arrangement allows for non-intrusive testing. (T) (T)

The Company will install demarcations and place fiber jumpers from the fiber optic termination panel to the demarcation point. The telecommunications carrier will run its fiber jumpers from the demarcation point (1x2, 90-10 optical splitter) to the telecommunications carrier's equipment.

In order to purchase dark fiber, telecommunications carriers must have collocation arrangements at the central offices or remote terminals (including controlled environmental vaults, and huts), on both ends (A-location and Z-location) of the dark fiber facility.

4. Revocations

The Company reserves the right to revoke the telecommunications carriers' right to access its ordered and/or provisioned dark fiber and reclaim the facility, regardless of whether the telecommunications carrier is using the facility, upon twelve (12) months' written notice. To exercise this right, the Company will provide supporting documentation demonstrating that the dark fiber being reclaimed is needed to meet the Company's bandwidth requirements within the next 12 months. The Company will provide an alternative facility for the telecommunications carrier with the same bandwidth as the telecommunications carrier was utilizing on the reclaimed facility. If the revocation of dark fiber is contested, the telecommunications carrier may file a dispute with the Commission after all means to resolve have been exhausted with the Company. The Company will not reclaim the dark fiber until the dispute is resolved by the Commission.

Additionally, should a telecommunications carrier not utilize the fiber strands within the 12-month period from the date of order, the Company reserves the right to revoke access to the dark fiber and recover those fiber facilities and return them to the Company's inventory. The Company may invoke this right by providing 10 days written notice to the telecommunications carrier that the Company is reclaiming the fibers.

Dark Fiber Cross Connects

Dark Fiber Cross-Connects are fiber jumpers that will be installed by the Company from the fiber optic termination panel to the demarcation point. There is one type of cross-connect, interoffice. Administration Charge

An administration charge applies any time a telecommunications carrier initiates an order. This charge applies once per telecommunications carrier order, regardless of the number of dark fiber strands ordered. Administration charges can be found in **PRICES** following

- Design and Central Office Connection Charge applies per Interoffice Transport Facility provided.
- Carrier Connection Charge applies to non-collocated EELs only. The charge applies for each termination per Interoffice Transport Facility provided.

Most nonrecurring charges apply to New EEL connection and disconnection request scenarios. Where appropriate, the nonrecurring charges are reflective as such.
