RULES, REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE (WATER)

- i) Refunds shall be made to the party who made such application and paid for such extension for each additional new Customer (other than "Customers who will immediately attach to the extension" as above referred to) who shall attach to and take service from the extension within one (1) year from the date of completion of such extension provided such additional new Customers shall make application for Regular Water Service Connection and such refunds shall be determined by multiplying one and one-half (1-1/2) times the average annual residential revenue for each new residential customer and by multiplying by one and one-half (1-1/2) times the first year's billing for service to a new commercial, industrial, or other non-residential customer. Refunds for commercial, industrial, or other non-residential customers who will immediately attach to the extension as noted in D above shall be an amount equal to one and one-half (1-1/2) times the difference between the annual revenue originally estimated and the actual revenue received provided the actual revenue is greater than the estimated revenue. If the actual revenue is less than the estimated revenue the difference shall be used as an offset against revenues, which would otherwise become the basis for refund, from additional new Customers.
- j) Total refunds to be made by the Company shall in no event exceed, in the aggregate, the amount paid to the Company by the applicant for the extension.
- k) No interest shall be payable by the Company on the applicant's payment or any unrefunded balance thereof.
- l) All mains, valves, fittings, and other appurtenances or materials installed in accordance with this rule shall be and remain the sole property of the Company.
- m) Extensions made under this rule shall be on the basis of a main size of eight (8) inches in diameter except as follows:

Unconserved Usage of Water for Air Conditioning Purposes

This is defined as water usage for air conditioning, wherever the water so used is not cooled by some suitable means (cooling tower, cooling pond, etc.) and then recirculated to the air conditioning equipment.

The "Tons of Capacity" of mechanical refrigeration equipment shall be taken to be whichever is the greatest, the maximum gallons of water per minute required for its operation or the manufacturer's rating in tons of cooling, or the compressor motor rating in horsepower. For fuel-fired sorption systems, the service charge shall be based upon whichever is the greater, twice the manufacturers' ton rating, or the maximum gallons of water per minute required for its operation.

Where water is directly used for cooling (rather than through a refrigeration system) the service charge is \$20.53 per gallon per minute of maximum flow, with the normal pressure imposed upstream of the device limiting the flow of water to the cooling equipment. The utility may require the use of an orifice of fixed size, with access sealed by the utility.

Where service is first used or connected after May 31st and before October 1st, the single monthly installment of 25% of the annual service charge first billed following the date of connection shall be prorated to reflect the fractional month of service.

Short-Term-Use Charge

Service under this schedule contemplates continuous month to month use. A customer who has service discontinued and then turned back on (other than for nonpayment of bill) within 12 months of date service was discontinued shall pay the applicable minimum monthly bill for each month service was not being used, but in no case shall the customer be charged less than three times the minimum monthly bill.

No charge shall be made for the transfer of an account to a new owner of the premises, made without disconnection and reconnection of service.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The due date for bills for utility service supplied to Federal, State, County, and Municipal governmental units and departments, including public school districts but not government-owned corporations, shall be thirty days from date of mailing.

19. Disconnection For Nonpayment

83. Ill. Adm. Code 280 details the provisions whereby the utility may discontinue service. The utility is required to give written notice of discontinuance substantially in the form outlined in and in accordance with the provisions of 83 Ill. Adm. Code 280.

20. Reconnection Of Service

After disconnection for nonpayment, service will be promptly restored after the customer:

- a. Has paid a charge of:
 - 1) \$35.00 for reconnection of service during regular business hours,
 - 2) \$50.00 for reconnection of service after regular business hours,
- b. Has paid the amount of the bill for which service was disconnected, and/or
- c. Has complied with the provisions of 83 Ill. Adm. Code 280.

The reconnection charge will be waived once each calendar year for each customer.

21. Budget Billing Plan

Residential and commercial customers may, upon request, have their electric, gas and water service billed under a budget billing plan. Customers electing the plan will have all of their meters billed on the plan.

A customer may apply for the budget billing plan at any time, although the established plan year is from September through July, with the twelfth month, August, serving as an adjustment period.

Monthly billings shall be in equal amounts during the first eleven months of the plan year. In the twelfth month, the billing will consist of the difference between payments to date and the total amount due for actual usage during the plan year. If there is a debit balance, this balance is due in the twelfth month. If there is a credit balance, the credit is applied or will be refunded if the customer requests it.

WATER

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The monthly budget pay installment amount shall be determined by dividing the total previous twelve months usage by twelve, adjusting for normal weather, applying current rates and tax to that adjusted usage, adjusting for anticipated rate changes, multiplying by twelve, dividing by eleven and rounding off to the nearest whole dollar. If a customer lacks a full year of service history, the Company shall estimate the usage. The budget pay installment amount is reviewed at the beginning of each subsequent plan year.

The monthly bill will show the amount of the current regular bill for service used on each meter, the budget pay installment amount and the debit or credit balance of the account. The budget pay installment amount is payable on or before the specified due date.

A customer may be removed from the budget billing plan for failure to pay the budget pay installment bills, as rendered. A customer may request to withdraw from the program. Upon removal or withdrawal, any debit balance becomes due. Credit balances will be applied to the customer's account or refunded, if requested to do so.

When a customer moves before the plan year is completed, the Company will close the budget pay account. The final bill will be adjusted for the current unbilled debit or credit balance.

22. Customer Activation Charge

In each case where water is established at the request of a customer, an initial charge of \$10.00 will be added to the first bill for service.

23. Late Payment Charges

A late payment charge equal to 1-1/2% per month on any amount for utility services considered past due shall be assessed to a Customer's account. - d) Should the actual cost of the extension be less than the estimated cost, the Company shall refund the difference as soon as the actual cost has been ascertained. Should the actual cost of an extension exceed the estimated cost, the applicant will pay to the Company the difference between the actual cost and the estimated cost as soon as such actual cost is determined by the Company and the applicant is notified in writing of the amount of such difference.
- e) For each Customer over the stated number of prospective Customers taking service from such extension within one (1) year after the date the extension is completed, the Company shall refund to the party who has contracted and paid for an extension an amount equal to one and one-half (1-1/2) times the total sewer bill of such additional Customer for the first year of service. Such refund shall, be paid in one lump sum upon completion of the first year of service to such additional Customer.
- f) The sum of the refunds made by the Company shall in no event exceed in the aggregate the amount paid to the Company for the extension, plus interest if the refunds are paid in installments.
- g) No interest shall be paid by the Company on the applicant's payment or on any unrefunded balances, except as above specified.
- h) At the expiration of said one (1) year period, the refund account will be closed and no further refunds will be made.
- i) The right to receive refunds under this rule shall be personal to the contracting applicant and shall not be assignable as collateral security or otherwise except with the written consent of the Company.

The bill shall be considered rendered to the customer when deposited in the U.S. mail with postage prepaid. Applicable to any customer who uses water from the customer's own wells or other sources and who uses, or desires to use, the Company's water service as a standby, auxiliary, or reserve service. Such standby service will be provided when the customer's own wells or alternative sources of water are inoperative or inadequate. Each customer served under this rate shall be required to enter into a written contract with the Company subscribing to a specific level of daily standby capacity and incorporating the provisions of this rate. A "large standby demand customer" is defined as a standby demand customer who subscribes to maximum day standby capacity of 500 ccf or more, determined by multiplying subscribed average daily standby capacity by a factor of 2.607.

BASIC SERVICE CHARGE

A standby customer shall pay a basic service charge as specified in the Company's general water service tariffs for the Sterling District applicable to the customer's meter sizes.

STANDBY DEMAND CHARGES

In addition to the foregoing basic service charge, a standby demand customer shall pay the following standby demand charges, regardless of the usage of water:

\$0.34 per ccf per day of subscribed daily standby capacity

The initial daily standby capacity shall be determined by the amount subscribed in the contract. The contracted demand may be resubscribed on an annual basis but any usage above subscribed demand during the summer season (June 1 through September 30) will automatically become the new subscribed level until 12 months expire.

SUPPLEMENTAL STANDBY DEMAND SERVICE

Upon forty-eight (48) hours prior written notice to the Sterling District Manager of the Company, and provided that the Company determines it has available capacity and only for as long as the Company so determines, a standby demand customer may obtain standby capacity in excess of subscribed standby capacity. The customer's notice shall specify the amount of supplemental daily standby capacity requested and the dates when the customer desires that the supplemental service begin and terminate. Supplemental standby demand service shall not be unreasonably withheld. Supplemental standby demand service shall terminate upon forty-eight (48) hours notice to a customer that the Company has determined that it no longer has available capacity, or upon two (2) hours notice in the event of an emergency, or upon the termination date requested by the customer, or upon written notice from the customer to the Sterling District Manager that the customer no longer desires such service, or in the event that a customer has not taken in excess of subscribed daily standby capacity for seven (7) consecutive days. IMPUTED DEMAND SUBSCRIPTION

If a customer fails to subscribe to a level of daily standby capacity prior to taking standby demand water service, the daily standby capacity shall be determined by the highest daily usage during the prior 12 months. For the first 12 months after the effective date of this tariff, "prior 12 months" shall mean the period subsequent to the effective date of this tariff through the then prior month. Such a customer shall not be eligible for supplemental standby demand service unless and until the customer subscribes to a level of daily standby capacity.

METERING COSTS

The customer shall pay that portion of the cost to install real time daily metering which exceeds the cost of a traditional meter.
