## Narrative Statement

The narrative statement in Bellwood's original petition stands the same. There will be an additional agreement with Franklin Park 9-1-1 for serving as a backup PSAP for the Bellwood 9-1-1 system.

The purpose of the modification of the original petition is to eliminate the Westchester 9-1-1 PSAP, and add Franklin Park PSAP as the backup for Bellwood 9-1-1 system.

An intergovernmental agreement has been agreed to by the Bellwood 9-1-1 PSAP and Franklin Park 9-1-1 PSAP for the following changes:

These mutually beneficial agreements are possible as both Franklin Park 9-1-1 and Bellwood 9-1-1 are staffed by the same personnel (Norcomm Public Safety Services), and provides for a more expedient transition in case of an outage. Agreements are renewed on a yearly basis, and should the agreeing entities choose not to terminate these agreements, the cancelling agency shall notify the other agency (ies) with at least 60 days of written notification by means of a certified letter to the corresponding ETSB.

Once a switch has been made from Norcomm to Franklin Park, calls will be answered by trained 9-1-1 personnel and equipment will be used that is in compliance as prescribed in Ill. Admin. Code Part 725.505(i). Calls will be handled based upon the nature of the switch. Should the Primary center become inhabitable, Norcomm personnel will be able to occupy dispatch positions at Franklin Park and direct dispatch for Norcomm agencies. Should the outage be of a temporary basis, calls shall be routed to the Norcomm center by way of (a) radio transmission or (b) secure telephone transmission. Should both resources not be available to Norcomm 9-1-1, Franklin Park will direct dispatch units.



INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF BELLWOOD AND  
THE VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN PARK FOR ENHANCED 9-1-1 EMERGENCY TELEPHONE  
SERVICE

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this 20th day of January, 2009, between the Village of Bellwood, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "Municipality" and the Village of Franklin Park.

WHEREAS, the Constitution of the State of Illinois, 1970, Article VII, Section 10, authorizes units of local government to contract or otherwise associate among themselves in any manner not prohibited by law or ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, 5 ILCS 220/1, entitled the "Intergovernmental Cooperation Act," provides that any power or powers, privileges or authority exercised or which may be exercised by a unit of local government may be exercised and enjoyed jointly with any other unit of local government; and,

WHEREAS, 5 ILCS 220/2, defines a public agency as follows:

"any unit of local government as defined in the Illinois Constitution of 1970, any school district, any public community college district, any public building commission, the State of Illinois, any agency of the State government or of the United States, or any other State, any political subdivision of another State, and any combination of the above pursuant to an intergovernmental agreement which includes provisions for a governing body of the agency created by the agreement."

WHEREAS, the Municipality is a unit of government situated partially within the corporate boundaries of the Cook County, Illinois and,

WHEREAS, the Wireless Emergency Telephone Safety Act (50 ILCS 751), paragraph 751/15, provides that 2 or more emergency telephone system boards or qualified units of local government may, by virtue of an

intergovernmental agreement, provide wireless 9-1-1 service for the other's jurisdictional boundaries.

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY AGREED THAT,

1. The Village of Franklin Park 9-1-1 center shall serve as a backup facility for the Village of Bellwood. In the event that 9-1-1 service has to overflow, or is compromised within the Village of Bellwood, calls shall be re-routed to the Franklin Park Police Department. As both centers are staffed by the same Agency (Norcomm Public Safety), it is within the interests of both Villages to work together.
2. This agreement shall be effective when signed by the Municipalities and will remain effective until JANUARY 30, 2010, renewed on a yearly basis and filed as part of the required filings with the Illinois Commerce Commission.
