I, **ERIC P. SCHLAF** being first duly sworn upon oath, depose and state as follows:




4. The answers contained in my Rebuttal Testimony are true and correct as of the date hereof to the best of my knowledge and belief.

**Commonwealth Edison Company's Response to
MC Squared Energy Services and Constellation New Energy ("MC-CNE") Data Request
MC-CNE 2.01 – 2.02

REQUEST NO. MC-CNE 2.01:

Regarding ComEd's Response to AG (MLB) 2.03, attachment 1, ComEd indicates that:
"with stimulus plan funding ComEd plans to: (i) Test technical limits of AMI technology in Chicago; and (ii) Significantly expand the number of participants in the customer programs."
With regards to this Response, please answer the following:

- A. Please explain the approximate expansion in size (total number and type of customer participants) and scope that ComEd is considering if they obtain stimulus funding.
- B. Will the expansion include non-residential customers? If so, what ComEd customer classes will be included?
- C. If stimulus funding is obtained, does ComEd intend to make a separate request for an IDC waiver? If not, does ComEd believe such a request would be unnecessary in that it would be "automatically" expanded if stimulus funding is obtained? Does ComEd's IDC waiver request also apply to any non-residential customer program?
- D. If the answer to the first part of Question 2.1C is yes, does ComEd envision considering alternatives to an expanded IDC waiver if stimulus funds are obtained?

RESPONSE:

- A. In its stimulus grant proposal submitted to the Department of Energy, ComEd intends to expand its AMI Pilot by adding approximately 120,000 meters to complete AMI deployment in the Maywood operating center and by adding approximately 60,000 meters in the City of Chicago. Furthermore, within the expansion discussed previously, ComEd intends to expand its customer application programs by approximately 50,000 customers who would potentially receive an in-home display and be placed onto a dynamic pricing program.
- B. Yes. While ComEd has not yet accumulated the requested data, it believes that the customer classes included in the expansion will be similar to those listed in ComEd's response to IIEC 2.01.
- C. ComEd has not yet made a determination as to whether to request an additional or expanded IDC waiver. Whether such a waiver will be requested may depend on the extent of stimulus funding obtained and the Commission's decision in this docket.
- D. See the response to (C) above.
