Subject: Senate Bill 1299: Enrollment Window

Patrick, good afternoon.

We have 2 questions for you regarding the following portion of the Illinois Senate Bill 1299:

"As of 10-17-09, the enrollment "blackout" window for a Mass Market account will be ten calendar days (for the rescission window) plus two business days prior to an account's scheduled meter reading date. In addition, if the tenth calendar day of the rescission window falls on non-business day, then the rescission window will be extended through the next business day. Because of this, the minimum number of calendar days ahead of time in which an enrollment DASR for a Mass Market account must be submitted to Ameren to be effective as of the next scheduled meter reading date will vary between 12 calendar days and 17 calendar days".

Our first question is, does the enrollment 'blackout' window referenced above only apply to companies using UCB/POR, or would this window also apply to BlueStar Energy? **The switching rules apply to all billing options, not just UCB/POR. So, yes, they do apply to BlueStar.**

Secondly, could you reference where in the Commissions order you are directed to use this new enrollment 'blackout' window, or is this provided within your tariff? **The enrollment blackout window is a result of the requirement for a ten calendar day rescission window for Mass Market accounts. This ten calendar day rescission window was thoroughly discussed in the SB1299 workshops and is referenced in our new Supplier Terms and Conditions tariff.**
