DGK-9.01 With respect to the Company's response to Staff Data Request DGK-6.01:

- a. In regard to the response to DGK-6.01 a, please explain the basis for Egyptian Gas Storage's ("EGS") being able to use Consumers' transportation capacity with Consumers making "...no capacity release for this gas...".
 - b. In regard to the response to DGK-6.01 c, the Company did not include invoices as requested, or mention why invoices were not proffered. Please provide the requested invoices or an explanation for not providing them.
 - c. In regard to Consumers' compliance with Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") regulations, is it the Company's position that it does not know if the Company complies with FERC regulations? If the answer is no, explain why the Company cannot answer SDR DGK-6.01 d.
 - d. Please provide a response to DGK-6.01 f.
- a. *Consumers did not release its pipeline capacity to Egyptian; however, Consumers gave Egyptian the right at not charge to use a portion of Consumers pipeline capacity. Consumers did bill Egyptian for the pipeline transportation charges.*
 - b. *In SDR DGK-4.02 a copy of Consumers General Ledger ACCT #142-100-004 was submitted showing charges to EGS for \$2,361.28 in July 06 and \$4,813.13 in October 06. These charges were for transportation costs of EGS gas thru Consumers pipeline capacity. Invoices are attached*
 - c. *Yes -- We do not know FERC regulations. Our opinion is we did not know Consumers was covered by FERC regulations.*
 - d. *Egyptian took title to the storage gas when it was put in the pipeline and title to Consumers portions of the gas was at the injection at meter 75661 which goes to the Mills Storage Field.*
