Letter of understanding:

This letter is to inform Robert Zimmerman, the property owner of 1708 W. Crescent, Park Ridge, that the construction of his house has caused a clearance violation at this address. The house has been built within 18 inches of the primary overhead wires. The National Electrical Safety Code requires a minimum distance of 7 feet 6 inches between energized wires and a structure.

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration requires that persons or conductive objects must maintain at least a 10 foot clearance from the lines. Any contact with or coming in close proximity to energized overhead wires may cause serious injury or death.

Mr. Zimmerman has requested temporary service for this residence from ComEd and has obtained the proper village electrical permits. ComEd is willing to provide this service with the understanding that all unqualified persons and any conductive objects will maintain a 10 foot clearance from any and all energized wires. Mr. Zimmerman has been given two options for relocating the wires at his cost. He must sign the contract prior to temporary service being provided and make final payment before construction work begins. Temporary service will be removed if ComEd obtains information and/or notice that any person or conductive object has violated the required clearances. The relocation of the overhead wires by ComEd will begin within 90 days from the date of the signing of this letter. If the relocation of the overhead wires is delayed by Mr. Zimmerman the temporary service will be removed.
