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1 JUDGE RILEY: Pursuant to the direction
2 of the Illinois Commerce Commission, I call
3 Docket 10-0379. This is an application by
4 IQ Telecom, Inc., for designation as an eligible
5 telecommunications carrier for purposes of receiving
6 Federal Universal Service Support, pursuant to
7 Section 214(e)(2) of the Telecommunications Act of
8 1996.

9 And beginning with counsel for the
10 applicant, would you enter an appearance for the
11 record, please.

12 MR. CROCKER: Yes.

13 Patrick Crocker, 107 West Michigan
14 Avenue, 4th Floor, Kalamazoo, Michigan 49007,
15 appearing on behalf of the applicant.

16 JUDGE RILEY: Thank you.

17 MR. WARD: Also on behalf of the applicant,

17 JUDGE RILEY: And, Mr. Cherry, are you entering
18 an appearance?

19 MR. CHERRY: No, I am not. Barbara Cohen is the
20 lawyer for UTAC.

21 JUDGE RILEY: Okay. Thank you.

22 Now I'm going to start off with Staff

1 once again and say where are we -- what is Staff's
2 position in this matter? I received 97 pages of
3 rebuttal testimony, which I read. What is the
4 situation now?

5 MS. LUCKEY: Well, Staff filed their rebuttal
6 testimony on June 29th and just basically we'll wait
7 to hear how the company would respond, whether they
8 would like to file surrebuttal and about how much
9 time they would need to do that.

10 JUDGE RILEY: Mr. Crocker?

11 MR. CROCKER: Yes, your Honor, we would like to
12 file rebuttal testimony, absolutely.

13 JUDGE RILEY: And do we have any idea how long
14 it's going to take to get that filed?

15 MR. CROCKER: Yes. We received the testimony on
16 June 29th, we would like until August 5th to file
17 the rebuttal testimony.

18 JUDGE RILEY: Is it actually surrebuttal that
19 we're talking about?

20 MR. CROCKER: Right.

21 MS. LUCKEY: That's correct, your Honor.

22 JUDGE RILEY: August 5?

1 MR. CROCKER: Yes.

2 JUDGE RILEY: Do we need a schedule beyond that
3 or do the parties want to wait and see what's in the
4 surrebuttal testimony?

5 MS. LUCKEY: I would leave that up to the
6 company whether or not they'd like to have a status
7 shortly thereafter.

8 MR. CROCKER: Yes, your Honor, as soon
9 thereafter as your schedule permits.

10 JUDGE RILEY: Is it my understanding that
11 Staff's position has not changed.

12 MS. LUCKEY: Staff's position has not changed at
13 this point. We look forward to seeing what the
14 company has to say in response to our testimony that
15 was just filed.

16 JUDGE RILEY: Okay. The surrebuttal will be in
17 by August 5. Would a status the following week be
18 sufficient -- sufficient enough time to digest the
19 testimony?

20 MS. LUCKEY: That should be fine, your Honor.

21 MR. WARD: Your Honor, I will be out of town
22 that week, that would probably be Mr. Crocker, if it

1 fits his schedule -- Pat, does that fit your
2 schedule?

3 MR. CROCKER: Yes.

4 JUDGE RILEY: Thursday the 11th?

5 MS. LUCKEY: That's fine for Staff.

6 JUDGE RILEY: Is that enough time? 10:00 a.m.?

7 Mr. Crocker, Ms. Cohen, is the 11th at
8 10:00 a.m. sufficient?

9 MS. COHEN: Yes, that will work.

10 MR. CROCKER: Yes, your Honor.

11 JUDGE RILEY: And that will be for a status.

12 Is there anything else we need to
13 discuss?

14 MS. LUCKEY: Nothing from Staff, your Honor.

15 JUDGE RILEY: We're just going to wait for the
16 testimony and see what that has to say.

17 MS. LUCKEY: That is the plan currently, but we
18 shall see going forward.

19 JUDGE RILEY: All right.

20 Mr. Crocker, anything further to add?

21 MR. CROCKER: Not today, your Honor.

22 JUDGE RILEY: Ms. Cohen?

1 MS. COHEN: No.

2 JUDGE RILEY: All right, then, I will leave it
3 at that. We will recess now and then reconvene on
4 Thursday, August 11, at 10:00 a.m. And, again, the
5 call-in number is most expeditious. And we'll see
6 what the response is to the surrebuttal testimony of
7 the applicant.
