1 PROCEEDINGS

2 JUDGE JONES: Good afternoon. I call for
3 hearing Docket Number 11-0341. This is titled in
4 part Illinois Commerce Commission on its own motion
5 versus Ameren Illinois Company d/b/a Ameren Illinois,
6 reconciliation of revenues collected under Rider EDR,
7 reconciliation of revenues collected under Rider GER.

8 At this time we will take the
9 appearances orally for the record. If you have
10 entered your appearance at a previous hearing in this
11 docket, you need not restate your business address or
12 phone number or respell your name unless any of those
13 things have changed or you simply prefer to do that.
14 Let's start with appearances on behalf of Ameren
15 Illinois Company.

16 MR. DE MONTE: Good afternoon, Your Honor.
17 This is Mark DeMonte appearing on behalf of the
18 Company.

19 JUDGE JONES: Thank you.

10 behalf of the People of the State of Illinois,

12 JUDGE JONES: Thank you.

13 Okay. Are there any other appearances
14 to be entered this afternoon?

16 Let the record show there are not, at
17 least at this time.

18 This matter was previously called for
19 hearing on October 18, 2011. I think there has been
20 some filings in the meantime, including a direct
21 testimony filing by Ameren Illinois Company. Is
22 there some further scheduling of an agreed-to nature

1 that the parties wish to propose at this time?

2 MS. LUCKEY: Your Honor, this is Nicole Luckey
3 from Staff. The parties have spoken before we went
4 on the record and discussed March 1, 2012, as a date
5 for Staff and Intervenor's direct testimony. Then
6 subject to your availability we had talked about
7 March 15, 2012, for a status hearing.

8 JUDGE JONES: Okay, thank you.

9 March 15 is available for that
10 purpose. What was the time again?

11 MS. LUCKEY: Whatever time is best for you.

12 JUDGE JONES: Okay. On the 15th available
13 would be either a ten o'clock or an eleven o'clock or
14 early afternoon, for that matter. Is there any
15 preferences?

16 MR. DE MONTE: Your Honor, I would suggest an
17 afternoon time, if it is not inconvenient for anyone.
18 Otherwise, I am available for any of the times you
19 just stated.

20 MS. MUNSCHE: The afternoon would work for CUB,
21 so.

22 MS. LUCKEY: The afternoon is fine for Staff.

1 MR. BOROVIK: That is fine for the People as
2 well.

3 JUDGE JONES: We can do that. Specifically
4 then is two o'clock, is that workable? Does anybody
5 have a problem with two o'clock?

6 MR. DE MONTE: That's good.

7 JUDGE JONES: All right. We will set that for
8 two o'clock then.
