JUDGE ALBERS: By the authority vested in me by the Illinois Commerce Commission, I now call Docket Number 11-0603. This docket concerns Ameren Illinois Company d/b/a Ameren Illinois and its verified petition for review and reconciliation of Rider EUA and Rider GUA.

7 filing, and we would propose to continue those

14 that morning if the time is all right with you folks.

16 MR. DE MONTE: That is fine for the company.

17 JUDGE ALBERS: All right. So I take it then
18 between now and then you will just be trying to
19 discuss your respective positions. And are you both
20 discussing how to resolve any potential disputes?

21 MR. DE MONTE: That is correct, Your Honor.
22 The time will be spent to narrow the contested

1 issues, if not eliminate.

2 JUDGE ALBERS: Oh, that's great.

3 MR. DE MONTE: That's the hope. Can't
4 guarantee it.

5 JUDGE ALBERS: I understand. I won't be upset
6 if there is less work for me to do. That's fine
7 then. Is there anything else for the record today?

8 MR. DE MONTE: Not from the company, Your
9 Honor.

10 MS. CARDONI: Nothing from Staff.

11 JUDGE ALBERS: Okay, thank you, all. You are
12 welcome to appear by phone again on the 15th, and I
13 will continue this matter to nine o'clock on August
14 15.
