## FSA reminds producers of upcoming program deadlines

Chrissy Brown, Executive Director of Edgar County USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) reminds producers that sign up for the Direct and Counter Cyclical Program (DCP) and the Average Crop Revenue Election Program (ACRE) ends on June 1, 2012.

In addition, producers have until June 1st to sign up for the Supplemental Revenue Assistance Payment Program (SURE) for the 2010 crop year. "We understand planting has started and it is harder for producers to find time to come into the office to enroll in these programs," Brown said. "June is quickly approaching and we encourage producers to come into the office to sign up for the programs."

Both DCP and ACRE participants must sign annual contracts to receive program benefits. All signatures of producers and landowners must be on file by the June 1, 2012, deadline.

Brown said producers who suffered

losses due to natural disasters during the 2010 crop year may be eligible to receive assistance through the SURE program. To be eligible for SURE, a farm must have: At least a 10 percent production loss adjusted for quality on a crop of economic significance; A policy or plan or insurance under the Federal Crop Insurance Act (FCIA) or the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) for all economically significant crops; Been physically located in a county that was declared a primary disaster county or contiguous county by the Secretary of Agriculture.

Individual producers may be eligible without this designation if the actual production on the farm is less than 50 percent of the normal production on the farm due to natural disaster.


