## HISTORY

**Area history**  
In 1912, Champaign business blocks would likely get reinforced concrete sidewalks in the near future, the city council decided. The existing stone flags (today known as flagstone) in front of most of the city's business houses were to be condemned. The issue had been under study since Miss Alta Anderson was injured in front of the Lyric Theatre a few months earlier, resulting in the city having to pay several hundred dollars.

In 1962, a proposal for revitalization of Champaign's Main Street was ready for city council action. It called for a parking plaza just east of the Illinois Central Railroad tracks with a well-lighted and landscaped area replacing a tavern and other spots that had required increased police attention. There also would be an off-street parking lot for Jos. Kuhn

and Co., replacing three vacant buildings at 43-49 Main St.

### International history

On June 12, 1942, Anne Frank, a German-born Jewish girl living in Amsterdam, received a diary for her 13th birthday; in it, she wrote, "I hope I will be able to confide everything to you, as I have never been able to with anyone, and I hope you will provide much support and comfort." (Less than a month later, Anne and her family went into hiding from the Nazis.)
