## Jesse White warns businesses of statewide corporate scam

Illinois Secretary of State Jesse White is warning businesses to beware of a scam targeting Illinois corporations.

A firm called Corporate Records Service is contacting Illinois businesses in an attempt to collect a \$125 fee to fill out a corporation's "Annual Minutes Records Form." The Illinois Business Corporation Act does not require corporations to file a "Minutes Records Form" or pay such a fee with the state or any private entity.

"The problem is that the form this bogus firm is sending out looks similar to our Secretary of State's annual report form," White said. "We are concerned that companies are filing the form and paying the \$125 because they believe they are filing their annual report with us, as

required by law." Although the bogus notice states that the fee must be paid by Sept. 2, 2012, there is no fee due to the state for that purpose. The only fee that corporations must pay is the fee that is paid with their annual report. Illinois corporations should be on the alert for this and other similar attempts to defraud them.

The Secretary of State's Office and Illinois Attorney General's Office are investigating this deceptive business practice. White is recommending that corporations do not reply to the solicitation. If a business has questions or wants to report that they have been a victim of the scam, please contact the Secretary of State's Office at 312-814-2201.

**Illinois to get new football scoreboard in 2013**—With the scoreboard at Memorial Stadium basically held together with "bailing wire," the U. of Illinois will replace it in 2013 with 6.7 million dollar board, that will include three "scrolling ring" type boards on the East and West sides of the upper deck and under the scoreboard, plus a smaller display for fans who can't

see the big one on the north wall of the south east tower. The new board will be 125 feet, 9 inches wide and 54 feet, 3.7 inches tall, compared to the present one which is 48 feet by 68 feet tall. The new scoreboard will be complete with LED screen and a new sound system. "It'll be one of the biggest boards in the country when its completed," said Ken Brown, DIA spokesman for the University of Illinois. The current scoreboard was installed in 2002 by the Chicago Bears and was gift to Illinois from the Bears after playing one season in Champaign due to Soldier Field being renovated. The cost of the new board will come from anticipated new football revenue and advertising. GO ILLINI!

# Trojans mangle Jacksonville ISD 56-8

## Big Blue climbs to 4-0 for the season

Scoring at will, the Triopia Trojans defeated Jacksonville ISD by a 56-8 final last Friday night.

Coach Rich Thompson used 10 different backs to register a 291-94 yard advantage on the ground and a 166-126 edge in the air for a 417-212 total yardage disparity.

"I thought we spread the wealth around to our backs in this one, using seven or eight (actually 10 backs carried the ball) backs in the game," said Thompson.

"We wanted to work on our passing game and this was an opportunity to do so. I thought Tanner (Huddleston) threw the ball very well (6-of-7). He found four different receivers in the game which was good."

Derrek Schone had another big night for the Big Blue, although seeing only limited action, he scored three times. Schone started the game off on the right

foot for the Trojans with an 80-yard kickoff return; this was his second kickoff return of the season. He also scored on a 19-yard run and gathered in a 42-yard TD reception from Tanner Huddleston. All of Schone's touchdowns came in the first period; he also was credited with 42-yards on two carries from scrimmage.

The "Mercy" rule (running clock) was put in motion at 5:56 of the second period when Tristan Wise romped 36-yards to pay dirt. Will Alexander led all rushers for the Trojans picking up 86 yards on 11 carries.

The Big Blue put 36-points on the scoreboard in the opening period with Schone scoring all three of his TD's in the first quarter, while Dakota Longley and Cody Curry also crossed the goal line, Longley on a long 55-yard gallop, and Curry burst through from the 11.

Triopia scored twice in the second period to run

the score to 50-0. The first touchdown when Josh Wilhite broke loose on a 26-yard romp, and Tristan Wise rambled 36 yards with 1:56 left until intermission.

Both teams scored a touchdown in the second half; both scores came in the fourth period with the running clock in motion as Curry crossed the goal line on a 3-yard burst,

ISD's Austin Bernal muscled in from 3-yards out for the Tigers' lone score. Bernal led all rushers with 90 yards on 11 carries.


