CITY'S OLDEST AFRICAN-AMERICAN CATHOLIC PARISH CELEBRATES 130 YEARS

St. Elizabeth, Chicago's oldest African-American Catholic parish, will mark its 130th anniversary with a series of events, beginning Nov. 4.

"The birth of the Black Catholic community in Chicago took place in this parish," said Rev. Richard Andrus, SVD, pastor of St. Elizabeth since 2000. "As our community grew and people moved to other neighborhoods on Chicago's south side, many other Black Catholic parishes were born from those who migrated from here. They took with them the power of faith that started here."

Located in the city's Bronzeville neighborhood, St. Elizabeth is the second oldest consecrated church in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

"This parish has an illustrious history," Fr. Andrus said. "St. Katharine Drexel, who founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, and Fr. Augustine Tolton, our country's first African-American priest, walked these streets. They played important roles in building this community and fostering positive race relations throughout the United States."

The Knights of Peter Claver and Ladies Auxiliary, the largest predominantly African-American lay Catholic organization in the United States, has its Chicago roots at St. Elizabeth. The parish's local chapter was founded in 1930.

Today's parish members carry on the tradition. Within the parish and through partnerships with community groups, the people of St. Elizabeth have founded several grassroots organizations. They include one of Chicago's earliest African-American credit unions; the Renaissance Collaborative, a collective effort by four ecumenical churches that provides housing for senior citizens, as well as people who strive to start new lives away from drugs and crime; and Neighbors Opposed to Weapons (NOW), a group that identifies tensions between street gangs and works to negotiate peace before violence erupts.

Commemorative events include:

- Street dedication ceremony, honoring Fr. Tolton, whose canonization process began last year
- Banquet dinner
- Mass, celebrated by Most Rev. Joseph Perry, auxiliary bishop of Chicago. The homily will be delivered by Most Rev. Dominic Carmon, SVD, auxiliary bishop emeritus of New Orleans and former pastor of St. Elizabeth.
