With this filing, Commonwealth Edison Company (ComEd) is submitting 2nd Revised Sheet No. 430 from Rate DSPP – Delivery Service Pricing and Performance to the Illinois Commerce Commission (Commission) *with no changes* in accordance with the provisions of subsection 16-108.5(e) of the Public Utilities Act (Act) to provide the Commission with an opportunity to consider revenue requirement neutral tariff changes related to ComEd’s delivery service cost allocation and rate design. This filing also is made to honor a commitment Dr. Ross

Hemphill, ComEd's Vice President of Regulatory Policy and Strategies, made in Docket No. 12-0321 (2012 Formula Rate Update Case) in which he stated, "[u]nless the Commission has an earlier opportunity to consider changes to the rate design formula in Rate DSPP and the allocation of costs among ComEd's delivery classes, ComEd will, no later than May 1, 2013, refile the rate design formula tariff provisions of Rate DSPP in a manner that permits the Commission and all stakeholders to consider those issues on a revenue neutral basis. This assurance means that interested stakeholders will have the opportunity, within a reasonably short period of time, to reexamine those cost allocation and rate design issues." (2012 Formula Rate Update Case, ComEd Ex. 1.0, p. 14:277-283).

ComEd is also proposing revisions to update a number of other miscellaneous charges and adjustments that are listed in various tariffs in its Schedule of Rates. These charges and adjustments were not updated through Docket No. 11-0721 (2011 Formula Rate Case) or the 2012 Formula Rate Update Case and they are not being updated in the formula rate update filing ComEd recently submitted to the Commission because they are not among the delivery service charges designed to recover the net annual revenue requirement identified in those formula rate proceedings. Exhibits supporting the determination of the updated other miscellaneous charges and adjustments are attached to testimony that is included in this filing. Additionally, there are proposed tariff revisions that serve to have certain values listed in informational sheets rather than in tariff sheets. These revisions will enable the compliance filings in ComEd's annual formula rate update cases to be submitted in a more streamlined fashion and will make it easier for customers and interested parties to locate those values in ComEd's Schedule of Rates.

Finally, ComEd is proposing tariff revisions that will allow it to make light emitting diode (LED) lighting units available to customers in its Fixture-Included Lighting Delivery Class.

In order to provide useful information to interested parties, ComEd is also submitting testimony exhibits that explain the purpose of the filing, provide a number of illustrative cost of service studies and rate designs to assist the Commission as it considers revenue requirement neutral tariff changes related to ComEd's delivery service cost allocation and rate design, and address ComEd's responses to directives from past Commission Orders.

Summary of Prepared Direct Testimony In Support of ComEd's Filing

ComEd's filed tariff revisions are supported by the direct testimonies of witnesses from within ComEd. The testimonies submitted with the filing are as follows:

- Ms. Christine M. Brinkman, C.P.A. - ComEd Exhibit (Ex.) 1.0 – Director, Rates and Revenue Policy, explains the basis for this tariff filing under provisions of the Act and how a Commission Order in a proceeding initiated by this filing should be coordinated with the results of ComEd's 2013 annual delivery service formula rate update case, the filing for which was made recently. Ms. Brinkman also briefly addresses ComEd's work to address cost allocation and rate design-related directives contained in recent Commission Orders. Finally, she identifies each other witness providing direct testimony in support of this tariff filing.
- Mr. Charles S. Tenorio - ComEd Ex. 2.0 – Manager, Regulatory Strategies and Solutions, presents the varying results of the rate design model with differing cost inputs. He also presents ComEd's proposed updates to the other miscellaneous charges and adjustments

that are listed in various tariffs in its Schedule of Rates, proposed tariff revisions that serve to have certain values listed in informational sheets rather than in tariff sheets, and ComEd's proposal to offer LED lighting units to the Fixture-Included Lighting Delivery Class. Moreover, Mr. Tenorio addresses the manner in which ComEd responded to a number of Commission directives from past Commission Orders. Finally, he provides the form of the public notice that ComEd will publish for this filing, which is similar to the form of the public notice required pursuant to 83 Illinois Administrative Code Part 255.20.

- Mr. Bradley L. Bjerning - ComEd Ex. 3.0 – Principal Regulatory Specialist, Regulatory Strategies and Solutions, presents an embedded cost of service study (ECOSS) that incorporates updated information pertaining to distribution losses, updated information pertaining to the costs associated with meter-related facilities, and other changes in response to prior Commission directives. This ECOSS is based on the ECOSS recently submitted in ComEd's 2013 formula rate update filing. In addition, Mr. Bjerning presents the results of six other illustrative ECOSSs, as well as three studies that were prepared in response to directives from past Commission Orders.
- Mr. Michael F. Born, P.E. - ComEd Ex. 4.0 – Manager, Distribution Capacity Planning, presents ComEd's Distribution System Loss Study, Secondary and Service Loss Study, and an update of a report pertaining to ComEd's use of railroad customers' electric traction power facilities.

Nature and Description of the Proposed Tariff Revisions

The tariff changes proposed by ComEd include the following:

- Rate BESH – Basic Electric Service Hourly Pricing (Rate BESH): Revisions have been proposed to Rate BESH (a) so that the Distribution Loss Factor (DLF) is provided through a reference to an informational sheet and (b) to update the Off Cycle Termination Fee.
- Rate RDS – Retail Delivery Service (Rate RDS): Revisions have been proposed to Rate RDS (a) so that the DLFs and Single Bill Option (SBO) Credit are provided through references to informational sheets and (b) to update the Split Load Direct Access Service Request (DASR) Fees and Nonstandard Switching Fees.
- Rate MSPS – Metering Service Provider Service (Rate MSPS): Revisions have been proposed to Rate MSPS to update the Meter Reading Charges, Metering Equipment Removal Charges, and Metering Service Provider (MSP)-Requested Work Charges.
- General Terms and Conditions (GTC): Revisions have been proposed to GTC (a) so that LED lighting units can be made available to customers in the Fixture-Included Lighting Delivery Class and (b) to update the Cable Television (CATV) Power Supply Test Fee, Duplicate Information Fee, Interval Data Fee, Invalid Payment Fee, and Reconnection Fee.


- **Rider ML – Meter-Related Facilities Lease (Rider ML):** Revisions have been proposed to Rider ML to update the Monthly Rental Charges (MRCs) and Standard Meter Allowances (SMAs).
- **Rider PE – Purchased Electricity (Rider PE):** Revisions have been proposed to Rider PE so that the DLFs are provided through a reference to an informational sheet.
- **Rider SBO – Single Bill Option (Rider SBO):** Revisions have been proposed to Rider SBO so that the SBO Credit is provided through a reference to an informational sheet.
- **Rate DSPP – Delivery Service Pricing and Performance (Rate DSPP):** The pertinent tariff sheet from Rate DSPP has been filed with no revisions in accordance with the provisions of subsection 16-108.5(e) of the Act to provide the Commission with an opportunity to consider revenue requirement neutral tariff changes related to ComEd’s delivery service cost allocation and rate design.

While the proposed tariff sheets included in this filing indicate a requested effective date of June 14, 2013, which is forty-five days after the April 30, 2013, filing date, ComEd fully anticipates that these tariff sheets will be suspended by the Commission so that the Commission and interested stakeholders will have an opportunity to consider revenue requirement neutral tariff changes related to ComEd’s delivery service cost allocation and rate design in accordance with subsection 16-108.5(e) of the Act, within a 240 day period of time in accordance with subsection 16-108.5(c) of the Act, that will result in the application of delivery service charges that reflect any cost allocation and rate design changes adopted by the Commission after such

consideration. The application of any such delivery service charges adopted by the Commission would commence for service provided beginning with the first January monthly billing period that starts no earlier than thirty (30) calendar days after the Commission issues the order in which it makes such adoption.

With the filing of this Supplemental Statement and the tariff sheets to which it relates, the Company will post a Public Notice of this filing in its office at Three Lincoln Centre in Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois 60181-4260 and will place copies of the proposed tariff sheets and this Supplemental Statement in the Public File in such office and on its Internet website.
