AG 2.2 When a municipality has such an agreement in place, do the school districts located within the community also receive free utility service? Or does the arrangement only apply to the municipality's municipal buildings?

According to the 2010 EPA Utility Franchise Agreement Summary Report, franchise agreements are set in place for municipal buildings solely occupied for municipal government purposes, for example, facilities such as fire and police stations, town halls and libraries.

This does not include revenue generating facilities such as water treatment plants, water pumping stations, ice rinks or municipal convention centers.

Schools generally do not receive unbilled energy under franchise agreements.
