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PROCEEDINGS

JUDGE YODER: By the authority vested in me by the Illinois Commerce Commission, I will now call Docket 12-0548. It's an action filed by the Illinois Commerce Commission on its own motion regarding Ameren Illinois Company seeking a reconciliation of revenues collected under power procurement riders with actual costs associated with those expenditures.

May I have the appearances for the record, please?

MR. DEMONTE: Good morning, Judge. This is Mark DeMonte, D-E-M-O-N-T-E, with the law firm of Jones Day, 77 West Wacker, Chicago, Illinois, 60601, appearing on behalf of the Company.

MR. OLIVERO: And appearing on behalf of the Staff witnesses of the Illinois Commerce Commission, Kimberly Swan and James Olivero. And I think we previously have had our addresses in the record.

JUDGE YODER: Is there anyone else wishing to enter their appearance in this record?

(No response.)

JUDGE YODER: Let the record reflect no response.

It's my understanding that the parties have

1 filed the testimony they intend to file. They
2 indicate that there are no contested issues and they
3 wish to proceed to an evidentiary hearing today.

4 Is that correct, Mr. DeMonte?

5 MR. DEMONTE: That's correct, your Honor.

6 JUDGE YODER: And Staff's prepared to
7 proceed today?

8 MR. OLIVERO: We are as well, your Honor.
9 Thank you.

10 JUDGE YODER: Mr. DeMonte, would you go
11 ahead and present your evidence?

12 MR. DEMONTE: Yes, your Honor. At this
13 time, Ameren Illinois would seek the admission into
14 the evidentiary record of Ameren Exhibit 1.0, which
15 was filed on e-Docket on September 26, 2013. It is
16 the direct testimony of Richard McCartney and
17 consists of 12 pages of testimony, plus an appendix.
18 I'd also move for Ameren Exhibit 1.1, which is the
19 affidavit of Mr. McCartney setting forth the
20 necessary basis for the testimony to be entered into
21 the record.

22 The Company would also move into evidence
23 Ameren Exhibit 2.0, which is the direct testimony of
24 Mr. David Brueggeman. It consists of seven pages of

1 testimony, plus an appendix. It was filed on
2 e-Docket on September 26, 2013. And along with that
3 is Ameren Exhibit 2.1, which is the affidavit of
4 Mr. Brueggeman.

5 And finally, the Company would move into
6 admission into the record of Ameren Exhibit 3.0,
7 which is the direct testimony of Mr. Dominic
8 Perniciaro. It consists of 10 pages of testimony,
9 plus an appendix. As well as Ameren Exhibit 3.1
10 through 3.11, which are exhibits that were filed
11 along with the direct testimony on September 26,
12 2013. And additionally, we would move the affidavit
13 of Mr. Perniciaro filed on March 4, 2014, which is
14 Ameren Exhibit 3.12.

15 And for clarity -- I am not certain I said
16 it for Mr. Brueggeman -- all of the affidavits were
17 filed on March 4, 2014.

18 JUDGE YODER: All right then. Is there any
19 objection to the admission of that testimony?

20 MR. OLIVERO: No, your Honor.

21 JUDGE YODER: Without objection, the
22 testimony identified by Mr. DeMonte will be admitted
23 into evidence based on the affidavits filed.

24 (Ameren Exhibits 1.0, 1.1, 2.0,

1 2.1, 3.0, 3.1 through 3.11 and 3.12
2 were admitted into evidence at this
3 time.)

4 JUDGE YODER: Anything further from the
5 Company in this docket?

6 MR. DEMONTE: No, your Honor.

7 JUDGE YODER: Is there anything to present
8 by Staff?

9 MR. OLIVERO: Thank you, your Honor.

10 At this time, Staff would move for admission
11 into the record of ICC Staff Exhibit 1.0, which is
12 the direct testimony of Daniel G. Kahle, which
13 consists of a cover page, three pages of narrative
14 testimony and Schedules 1.01 RZ I, 1.01 RZ II, and
15 1.01 RZ III. And this document and schedules were
16 filed on the Commission's e-Docket system January 28,
17 2014.

18 And Staff would also move for admission into
19 the record of ICC Staff Exhibit 1.1, which is the
20 affidavit of Daniel G. Kahle. And that document was
21 filed on the Commission's e-Docket system yesterday,
22 March 24, 2014.

23 And that's all we would have, your Honor.

24 JUDGE YODER: Thank you.

1 Is there any objection to the admission of
2 Mr. Kahle's direct testimony and the accompanying
3 exhibits as supported by his affidavit?

4 MR. DEMONTE: No objection, your Honor.

5 JUDGE YODER: All right then. Without
6 objection, that evidence will be admitted into
7 evidence in this docket.

8 (ICC Staff Exhibits 1.0 and 1.1
9 were admitted into evidence at this
10 time.)

11 JUDGE YODER: There being no further
12 evidence or being no contested issues then, I will
13 have the record marked heard and taken.

14 It's my understanding from a discussion
15 before we went on the record that the Company intends
16 to prepare a Draft Order and present that to Staff,
17 and anticipate that they would present it to Staff
18 around May 16th and hope to have an agreed Draft
19 Order to send to me on May 23rd -- around May 23rd.

20 Is that correct, Mr. DeMonte?

21 MR. DEMONTE: That is correct, your Honor.

22 JUDGE YODER: With that understanding,
23 anything further in this docket?

24 MR. OLIVERO: I was just wondering, when

1 they send it to you, is that just by e-mail or do
2 they file that on e-Docket?

3 JUDGE YODER: If the Company wishes to file
4 it on e-Docket, that's fine. I don't think it's
5 necessary. But if they want to, that's fine.

6 MR. OLIVERO: Thank you.

7 JUDGE YODER: Assuming it's been agreed to
8 between the parties, that's fine.

9 Anything further from Staff?

10 MR. OLIVERO: Nothing, your Honor.

11 JUDGE YODER: I can't remember if I asked
12 you, Mr. DeMonte. Anything further from the Company?

13 MR. DEMONTE: Nothing further, your Honor.

14 JUDGE YODER: All right then. Thank you for
15 calling in. And I will await the submission of the
16 Draft Order. Thank you.
