



I. BY THE COMMISSION

A. Statement and Findings of Fact

1. On August 14, 2000, SCC Communications Corp. ("SCC") filed an application for a Certificate to Provide Local Exchange Telecommunications Services ("CPLE") for the exclusive purpose of providing Basic Emergency Services and a Notice of Intention to Exercise Operating Authority.

2. On August 18, 2000, the Commission issued a Notice of Application Filed and Notice of Hearing, giving notice of this application to all interested parties. Interventions were due on or before September 18, 2000. None were filed.



1. The application is unopposed and may be considered without a hearing. § 40-6-109(5), C.R.S.

2. Granting the application of SCC is consistent with the legislative policy statements contained in §§ 40-15-101, 40-15-501, and 40-15-502, C.R.S.

3. The granting of a CPLE for the exclusive purpose of providing Basic Emergency Services, combined with the approval of a Notice of Intention to Exercise Operating Authority, constitutes a grant of a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide Basic Emergency Services.

4 *Code of Colorado Regulations* ("CCR") 723-29.3 and 4 CCR 723-35.4

4. Before providing Basic Emergency Services SCC must: (1) have effective tariffs and price lists for its services on file with the Commission; and (2) comply with all statutory and regulatory requirements applicable to basic emergency service providers subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission.

II. ORDER

A. The Commission Orders That:

1. The hearing in this matter set for November 20, 2000 is vacated.

2. SCC Communications Corp.'s application is deemed complete.

3. SCC Communications Corp. is granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide Basic Emergency Services. The Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity covers the State of Colorado.

4. SCC Communications Corp. shall have the obligation to serve all customers in its service territory on a non-discriminatory basis.

5. SCC Communications Corp. shall file applicable tariffs and price lists before commencing operations under this Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity.

6. In accordance with the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, SCC Communications Corp. will be required to maintain its books of accounts and records using Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. 4 *Code of Colorado Regulations* 723-1-25(c).

7. SCC Communications Corp. will not seek to draw from the Colorado High Cost Fund or from the universal service fund at this time.

8. Consistent with terms and conditions established in previous Commission decisions, SCC Communications Corp. will be required to participate in the Colorado High Cost Fund, the

Telecommunications Relay Services for the Disabled Telephone Users Program, the Emergency Telephone Access Act Program, and other financial support mechanisms that may be created in the future by the Commission to implement §§ 40-15-502(4) and (5), C.R.S.

9. This Order is effective on its Mailed Date.
