NARRATIVE STATEMENT

The narrative statement in the original Champaign County ETSB petition stands the same. A new backup agreement has been established with the Vermilion County 9-1-1 Communications Center to serve as the backup PSAP for METCAD, the primary PSAP in Champaign County.

In the current plan, the Village of Rantoul Police Department operates the only other PSAP in Champaign County and provides METCAD with 9-1-1 backup services. The Board of the Village of Rantoul has decided to close their PSAP and has contracted with METCAD to perform dispatch services.

The purpose of this modification is to secure backup PSAP services for Champaign County. On May 1, 2014, the Vermilion County 9-1-1 Communications Center signed an agreement with METCAD to provide 9-1-1 backup services for Champaign County, Illinois. The Vermilion County 9-1-1 Communications Center is a full function, 8-position PSAP providing both landline and wireless 9-1-1 service to Vermilion County, Illinois. The Rantoul Police Department will no longer operate a 9-1-1 PSAP or serve as backup to METCAD, given approval of this modification request.

An Intergovernmental Agreement has been executed between the Vermilion County 9-1-1 Communications Center and the City of Champaign, on behalf of the METCAD Policy Board. Vermilion County is already a certified PSAP and, as such, is in compliance with Public Utilities ICC, Part 725.

9-1-1 calls for service for Champaign County, which are answered by the Vermilion County 9-1-1 Communications Center, will be dispatched in the following manner:

1. 9-1-1 Calls for service shall be transferred to the 9-1-1 trunks for Champaign County.
2. In the event that the calls can not be transferred to the 9-1-1 trunks, calls shall be transferred to 217/333-8911 (the 10-digit administrative line answered in the PSAP).
3. In the event 1 and 2 above are not possible, necessary call details will be obtained and relayed to 217/333-1216, the University Police Department Front desk, which is staffed on a 24/7/365 basis, where emergency services will be directly dispatched via radio.

This backup arrangement is made possible by the fact that both METCAD and the Vermilion County 9-1-1 Communications Center are served by the AT&T Champaign-Main Selective Router.



A RESOLUTION

**AUTHORIZING THE METCAD POLICY BOARD
TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE VERMILION COUNTY
EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD TO PROVIDE
BACK-UP 9-1-1 SERVICES FOR METCAD**

Whereas, the Champaign County Emergency Telephone System Board was granted authority to operate an enhanced 9-1-1 system on February 22, 1996; and

Whereas, the Metropolitan Computer Aided Dispatch (METCAD) Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) has answered 9-1-1 calls for all of Champaign County, with the exception of the Village of Rantoul, which has operated its own PSAP; and

Whereas, the Village of Rantoul and the METCAD Policy Board recently agreed to consolidate the Rantoul PSAP into METCAD, establishing a single PSAP for all of Champaign County; and

Whereas, the METCAD Policy Board has been established as the governing body for METCAD by Intergovernmental Agreement and the City of Champaign has been established as the lead agency for METCAD.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CHAMPAIGN COUNTY
EMERGENCY SYSTEM TELEPHONE BOARD, as
follows:**

Section 1. That the Board hereby grants authority to the METCAD Policy Board to enter into an agreement for backup services with the Vermilion County Emergency Telephone System Board for the purpose of providing backup 9-1-1 services.

Section 2. That the METCAD Director is directed to send a copy of the Resolution to Marci Elliott, 9-1-1 Program Manager, Illinois Commerce Commission, 527 E. Capitol Ave., Springfield, IL 62701.

**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR BACKUP 911 SERVICES
METCAD AND VERMILION COUNTY EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM
BOARD**

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Computer Aided Dispatch Agency located in Urbana, Illinois, ("METCAD"), is a public safety answering point ("PSAP"), authorized by the Illinois Commerce Commission ("ICC") to provide 9-1-1 emergency telephone services, ("9-1-1 services") for residents in Champaign County, Illinois, ("Champaign County") including, but not limited to, emergency telephone services for the police and fire services for the Cities of Champaign and Urbana in Illinois, the University of Illinois at the Champaign/Urbana campus, the Champaign County Sheriff's Department, the Village of Rantoul; and rural public safety agencies; and

WHEREAS, Vermilion County Emergency Telephone System Board ("VC ETSB" or "Back-up PSAP") is a PSAP authorized by the ICC to provide 9-1-1 emergency telephone services for residents in Vermilion County, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Vermilion County, Illinois and Champaign County, Illinois are contiguous with one another; and

WHEREAS, METCAD has requested that VC ETSB provide a backup for 9-1-1 services in the event that the METCAD 9-1-1 emergency system is unable to provide those services for one or more of the reasons described below in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, standards promulgated by the Illinois Commerce Commission require emergency telephone systems to have a back-up PSAP; and

WHEREAS, the VC ETSB and METCAD each believe it is in the best interest of the general public for the VC ETSB to provide back-up 9-1-1 services to METCAD in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement given the proximity of Champaign County to Vermilion County and the need to identify the most efficient, effective and equitable means of delivering said back-up services.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED by and between METCAD, hereinafter referred to as the "PSAP" and the VC ETSB, hereinafter referred to as the "Back-up PSAP" as follows:

1. The above "Recitals" are hereby incorporated into the body of this Agreement and made a part hereof by reference thereto.

2. **Term of Agreement.** This Agreement shall become effective on ^{May}~~April~~ 1, 2014 and, unless sooner terminated as hereinafter provided, shall be in force for a term of two years from that date, provided that the Agreement shall automatically be renewed for an additional one-year term at the conclusion of any term unless one of the parties hereto provides written notice to the other party, a minimum of 180 days prior to termination of the current term, of an election not to renew for that additional one-year term.

3. Requested Services. The Back-up PSAP, subject to being operable and available, agrees to provide back-up 9-1-1 services, hereinafter referred to as the "requested services", for the PSAP at the VC ETSB facility ("Back-up PSAP Facility") in the event that the PSAP becomes inoperable or cannot otherwise adequately handle the volume of incoming 9-1-1 emergency calls because of one or more of the following reasons:

- a. Equipment and/or facilities necessary for the proper functioning of the PSAP are damaged as a result of a natural disaster, electrical failure, or any other occurrence that results in the PSAP becoming inoperable, or put out of order or otherwise made non-functional.
- b. Scheduled downtime to facilitate 9-1-1 service system maintenance or upgrades.
- c. There exists an emergency which generates a volume of 9-1-1 emergency calls that overloads the capacity of the PSAP.

4. No Dispatch Service. The Back-up PSAP shall not provide dispatch of the emergency services of the PSAP as a part of this Agreement. In accordance with protocols agreed to by the PSAP and the Back-up PSAP, the "requested service" to be provided by the Back-up PSAP shall consist of receiving calls forwarded to the Back-up PSAP from the PSAP and then forwarding the emergency information so received via telephone to a designated agency of the PSAP for its dispatch of emergency personnel. PSAP shall provide to the Back-up PSAP such equipment, information, software, maps, guides, etc. as are necessary for the Back-up PSAP to immediately determine the location of the emergency and the proper response service to be contacted.

5. Dispatch of PSAP employees to assist in providing requested services.

- a. Emergency Back-up Services. When the PSAP is in need of the requested services because of an unscheduled, emergency situation as described in this Agreement, the PSAP will immediately contact the on-duty supervisor at the Back-up PSAP Facility (Back-up PSAP Supervisor") by telephone to provide notice of the need for said services and coordinate with said Supervisor the prompt dispatch of a minimum of two (2) PSAP employees ("Loaned Dispatchers") to the Back-up PSAP Facility for purposes of assisting with the provision of the requested services.
- b. Scheduled Back-up Service. When the Back-up PSAP is asked to provide the requested services for interruption of 9-1-1 services caused by the need to temporarily suspend said services during scheduled maintenance of the PSAP facilities or equipment, the PSAP shall provide the Back-up PSAP with written notice of said scheduled service interruption a minimum of **forty-eight (48) hours** prior to said interruption. The written notice shall provide a good faith estimate of the duration of the interruption of services. The PSAP agrees to provide, at the request of the Back-up PSAP Supervisor, a minimum of two (2) Loaned Dispatchers to perform 9-1-1 services on the premises of the Back-up PSAP Facility for the duration of the time the Back-up PSAP is performing the requested services.

- c. Supervision/Employment Status/Compensation of Loaned Dispatchers. Said Loaned Dispatchers, during the time they are performing said requested services on the premises of Vermilion County, will perform said services under the direct supervision of Back-up PSAP Supervisor . Notwithstanding said supervision by the Back-up PSAP Supervisor and any other terms or conditions in this Agreement, said Loaned Dispatchers shall be deemed to be the PSAP's employees during all times they are providing requested services, and accordingly, all compensation for said work shall be paid by the PSAP. The PSAP shall provide, through self insurance and commercial insurance in limits it sees fit and may change from time to time, the following:

Commercial General Liability, Auto Liability and Workers' Compensation.

The PSAP agrees that if any Loaned Dispatchers sustain a work related injury while performing services at the Back-up PSAP, the PSAP shall be responsible to pay any medical bills or other compensation it may be required to pay under the Workers' Compensation Act 820 ILCS 305, the Occupational Diseases Act 820 ILCS 310, or the Emergency Telephone System Act 50 ILCS 70/h; *et seq.*

- 6. Costs of Back-up Services.** The PSAP shall be responsible for reimbursing the Back-up PSAP for certain costs incurred by the Back-up PSAP for providing the requested services. Such costs shall include the following:

Personnel Costs, including overtime payments, for additional personnel called in to the Back-up PSAP; Reprogramming of Customer Premise Equipment; 9-1-1 Network Routing Changes; Mapping Updates; Equipment and Software Updates or Changes.

- 7. Initial Configuration of Equipment and Facilities to Facilitate Performance of Requested Services.** The PSAP and the Back-up PSAP will each, upon execution of this Agreement, promptly take the necessary steps to contact and coordinate with AT&T, the 9-1-1 service provider, to modify 9-1-1 call routing protocols to allow 9-1-1 calls to be properly routed when necessary to provide the requested services, and notify any other necessary telephone system providers.

- 8. Operational Guidelines.** The PSAP and the Back-up PSAP agree to develop and, as needed, revise operational guidelines to describe in more detail the parties' respective responsibilities in facilitating the Back-up PSAP's performance of the requested services.

- 9. Relationship Between the Parties.** In consideration of the mutual services provided herein, both parties agree that nothing contained herein is intended or should be construed in any manner to create an agency relationship between the parties. The individual parties are and shall remain independent entities with respect to all services performed under this Agreement. Each party agrees that in the performance of any of the requested services, its employees shall not require nor be entitled to any compensation, rights or benefits of any kind whatsoever from the other party.

10. Other Liabilities. The PSAP agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Back-up PSAP from any claims alleging bodily injury, including death, and/or property damage, arising out of the performance of the loaned 9-1-1 dispatchers during times that they are providing the requested services. Nothing in this Agreement is intended in any way to waive or in any manner diminish any immunities from civil liability that either METCAD, Vermilion County or any employees or agents of either entity otherwise are granted by State law, including but not limited to, the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act. (745 ILCS 10/1-101 et seq), or the Emergency Telephone System Act 50 ILCS 750/1 et seq.

11. Termination. This Agreement may be terminated without cause prior to the term set forth above by either party upon prior written notice to the other party provided a minimum of 180 days prior to the proposed date of termination.

12. Notices. Notices and communications to METCAD pursuant to this Agreement shall be addressed to and delivered at the following address:

13. Rights Cumulative. Unless expressly provided to the contrary in this Agreement, each and every one of the rights, remedies and benefits provided by this Agreement shall be cumulative and shall not be exclusive of any other rights, remedies, and benefits allowed by law.

14. Non-Waiver. Neither Party shall be under any obligation to exercise any of the rights granted to it in this Agreement. The failure of either Party to exercise at any time any rights granted to it shall not be deemed or construed to be a waiver of that right, nor shall the failure void or affect the Party's right to enforce that right or any other right.




15. Subject to ICC Approval. This Agreement shall be subject to approval by the Illinois Commerce Commission.

16. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois.

17. **Severability.** It is hereby expressed to be the intent of the Parties to this Agreement that should any provision, covenant, agreement, or portion of this Agreement or its application to any Person or property be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Agreements and the validity, enforceability, and application to any Person or property shall not be impaired thereby, but the remaining provisions shall be interpreted, applied, and enforced so as to achieve, as near as may be, the purpose and intent of this Agreement to the greatest extent permitted by applicable law.

18. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes any and all prior agreements and negotiations between the Parties, whether written or oral, relating to the subject matter of this Agreement.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this agreement to be executed by proper officers duly authorized to execute the same on the dates set forth beneath the respective signatures.

AGREEMENTS

For 9-1-1 Emergency Communications

This agreement is made between the Champaign County Enhanced 9-1-1 System, hereinafter referred to as "Champaign County 9-1-1" and the Village of Rantoul, for the purpose of effective handling and routing of 9-1-1 Emergency calls.

• **CALL HANDLING (Exhibit 8)**

Champaign County 9-1-1, upon receiving a call for emergency services in your jurisdiction, shall dispatch the call in the following manner:

Primary: Direct Dispatch

Secondary: Telephone Relay to Police Front Desk

• **AID OUTSIDE JURISDICTION BOUNDARY (Exhibit 9)**

Once an emergency unit is dispatched in response to a request through the system, such a unit shall render its service to the requesting party without regard to whether the unit is operating outside its normal jurisdictional boundaries. This provision notwithstanding, nothing in this agreement shall supersede approved local agreement for mutual aid or assistance, nor require provision of fire protection services to non-subscribers in such areas where fire protection is provided on a subscription or elective user-fee basis.

The legislative intent is that 9-1-1 be used for emergency calls only. Therefore, all calls of an administrative or non-emergency nature shall be referred to your agency's published telephone number.

Champaign County 9-1-1 agrees to keep all records; times and places of all calls. All records will be available to all participants of the 9-1-1 system.

It shall be the responsibility of your agency to maintain the report of call and the disposition of each call received.

All agreements, management, records and service will be the responsibility of the advisory and policy boards.

The 9-1-1 advisory board must approve any agreements or changes in agreements and operating policies.
