WHEREAS, the county of Williamson has enacted into law various ordinances establishing a 911 emergency telephone system and an Emergency Telephone System Board; and

WHEREAS, the WCETSB has established or will establish an enhanced 911 emergency telephone system for purposes of dispatching emergency services to the public and residents of Williamson County, Illinois, and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary to determine the manner and procedure for effective handling and routing of enhanced 911 emergency calls by and between Williamson County, Illinois, and the SCSD,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and of the mutual covenants and agreements set forth herein, the WCETSB and the SCSD do hereby agree as follows:

The purpose of the Williamson County E9-1-1 System is to provide the most convenient and efficient emergency service possible to the citizens of Williamson County and its municipalities. In recognition of this purpose, the following call handling agreement has been devised to facilitate call answering between and for the parties.

1. Should the SCSD receive a call for emergency services in the area served by the WCETSB PSAP, the call shall be transferred to the WCETSB PSAP located at the Williamson County Sheriff's Department in the following manner: Primary-by telephone number 997-6543 or secondary-in the event telephone communication is not possible, the SCSD may contact the WCETSB PSAP through the L.E.A.D.S. computer network.

2. Should the WCETSB PSAP receive a call for emergency services in the area served by the SCSD, the call shall be transferred to the SCSD in the following manner: Primary- by telephone 252-8661 or secondary-in the event telephone communication is not possible, WCETSB PSAP will contact the SCSD via the L.E.A.D.S. computer.

3. The parties agree to keep all records, times and places of the 9-1-1 calls on file as specified herein. All such records shall be available to the parties. The parties shall maintain records as required by the Illinois Commerce Commission including the reports of all calls, their times, and their dispositions.

4. Once an emergency unit is dispatched in response to a 9-1-1 request for service and subsequently determines the address/location is outside of its jurisdiction, it shall render aid without regard to its jurisdictional boundaries until relieved.

5. Any other responses by agencies providing emergency service outside of their respective serving areas, except as noted above, shall be made in accordance with established mutual aid procedures and agreements in effect at this time.

6. Any agreements or changes in agreements and or/operating policies must be approved by the parties hereto and any other agency providing emergency service which is effected.

**AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM
BOARDS OF WILLIAMSON AND SALINE COUNTIES**

5-30-97

This agreement is made between the Williamson County Emergency Telephone System Board and the Saline County Emergency Telephone System Board for the purpose of effective handling and routing of 9-1-1 emergency calls from a small area of eastern Williamson County.

WHEREAS; There are currently in Williamson County, 9 telephone lines with either the 252 , 253 , 994 or 268 prefix.

WHEREAS; The Saline County 911 system is already serving those 9 customers,

WHEREAS; Saline County is now responsible for handling 9-1-1 calls from the GTE prefixes of 268 Raleigh, 994 Carrier Mills and 252, 253 Harrisburg.

WHEREAS: Saline County is already paying the network charges for those exchanges and would pay no additional charge for continuing to serve those 9 customers.

WHEREAS, It would not be cost effective for the Williamson County ETSB to pay a \$2022 installation charge and duplicate network charges of \$6852 per year for serving just 9 customers.

WHEREAS; Williamson County now collects about \$167 per year in surcharges from those customers, and by the time the system goes on line will have collected over the past three plus years a total of about \$540 from those customers

THEREFORE; The Williamson County ETSB and the Saline County ETSB agree that calls from this area of Williamson County will be selectively routed to the Saline County PSAP then handled, dispatched or transferred in the manner detailed below. In return Williamson County will pay Saline County the past and continuing surcharge generated by customers with the 268, 994, 252 and 253 Saline County exchanges. A payment of \$540 will be made upon approval of this agreement. Annual payments of \$167 will be made each time the annual contract is renewed.

CALL HANDLING

A call requiring police, fire or ems response will be transferred via router code to the Williamson County PSAP. If it is determined that a fire or ems response from Saline County would be closer, Saline County will dispatch the agency and notify Williamson county via telephone or leads computer.

Saline County will keep a record of each call and will make it available to Williamson County if needed. Williamson County will provide Saline County with a map of the eastern portion of Williamson County with addressing information.

This agreement goes into effect the day the Williamson County system goes on line and is in force for one year.

WHEREAS, the Jackson County Ambulance Service has agreed to respond to emergencies at Touch of Nature Environmental Center which is SIU-C owned properties, and

WHEREAS, the Carbondale Fire Department has an agreement with SIU-C to respond to emergencies on SIU-C owned properties, and

WHEREAS, the Makanda Fire Department has agreed to respond to fires at the Touch of Nature Environmental Center.

WHEREAS, both the JCETSB and WCETSB have informed the Illinois Commerce Commission of their intent that the Williamson County area of the Touch of Nature Environmental Center be included in the Jackson County 911 System.

WHEREAS, it is the intent of all parties involved that proper and timely emergency service response be provided in the event of a 911 call from SIU-C owned properties.

**SPECIAL CALL HANDLING AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE
FRANKLIN COUNTY EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD AND THE

WHEREAS; Franklin County received permission from the Illinois Commerce Commission to begin enhanced 911 service in 1996 excluding the 942 exchange, and

WHEREAS; A new enhanced 9-1-1 telephone system will go on line in 1997 in Williamson County, providing enhanced service to all callers within the 942 exchange, and,

WHEREAS; Nearly all of the those customers receive their emergency services from the Freemanspur Police and Fire Departments and the Williamson County Ambulance Service, all located within Williamson County.



THEREFORE; The Franklin County ETSB and the Williamson County ETSB agree that all 911 calls from the 942 exchange shall be routed to Williamson County PSAPs for dispatch.

THEREFORE; Williamson County agrees to pay GTE the monthly charge for providing 911 service to that exchange,
