RESPONSE: Subject to and without waiver of the General Objections listed above, American Broadband states as follows. See the Table below.

Plan description of \$9.25 Prepaid Wireless Lifeline offering:

- Free Cell Phone
- Free 250 Minutes Per Month
- Free 250 Text Messages Per Month
- Free Caller ID
- Free Call Waiting
- Free 3 Way Calling
- Free Voicemail

- No Monthly Bill
- No Contract
- No Money Down

If the customer exhausts their texts or voice minutes they can purchase a prepaid add on plan. These plans are listed below:

(b) The dollar amount of E9-1-1 surcharges that the Applicant will remit for each package per customer per month pursuant to the Prepaid Wireless 9-1-1 Surcharge Act and the schedule for such remittances for sales in Chicago and non-Chicago, respectively; and

RESPONSE: Subject to and without waiver of the General Objections listed above, American Broadband states as follows. Per the Prepaid Wireless 9-1-1 Surcharge Act, sellers of prepaid wireless telecommunications service have the duty to collect wireless E911 surcharges from buyers at the point of sale. The prepaid wireless E911 surcharge amount is 7% of the retail transaction, if the point of sale is in Chicago, and 1.5% of the retail transaction, if the point of sale is in "non-Chicago" areas. American Broadband will remit the proper percentage per month according to these parameters. However, according to Section 15(f) of the Prepaid Wireless 9-1-1 Surcharge Act "[I]f a minimal amount of prepaid wireless telecommunications service is sold with a prepaid wireless device for a single, non-itemized price, then the seller may elect not to apply the percentage specified in subsection (a) or (a-5) of this Section 15 to such transaction. For purposes of this subsection, an amount of service denominated as 10 minutes or less or \$5 or less is considered minimal." American Broadband understands that to be exempted from the prepaid wireless E911 surcharge, the minimal amount of prepaid wireless service must be sold with a prepaid wireless device for a single, non-itemized price.

Based on the aforementioned, American Broadband would remit \$0.65 ($\$9.25 \times 7\%$) for retail transactions in Chicago, \$0.14 ($\$9.25 \times 1.5\%$) for retail transactions in "non-Chicago" areas for the base \$9.25 package. The amount will be recalculated using the same percentage rates should the customer purchase add-ons to the package.

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
