PETITION TO WITHDRAW LICENSE AS ARES

DTE Energy Supply, Inc., (“DTES”) hereby petitions to withdraw its certificate as an Alternative Retail Electricity Supplier (“ARES”) and to terminate a certain payment guaranty based on the following:

1. In an order entered on April 13, 2010, in Docket No. 10-0119, this Commission awarded DTES a certificate as an ARES under Section 16-115 of the Public Utilities Act to provide service to all eligible nonresidential retail customers. All of DTES’ customers were located in either the Ameren Companies service territory or the Commonwealth Edison Company service territory.
2. On September 24, 2014, DTEES entered into an Asset Purchase Agreement with Integrys Energy Services, Inc. and Integrys Energy Services of New York, Inc. (collectively, “Integrys”). ARES customers of DTES that transferred to Integrys were not impacted, as customer contracts were not

modified in any way (except for provider) when the assignment occurred. Moreover, DTES continued to supply its few remaining ARES customers not covered by the Asset Purchase Agreement through the end of their contracts. As of February 15, 2015, DTES had no further ARES supply obligations in Illinois and now desires to officially terminate its ARES license.

4. With respect to the ARES customers Integrys assumed, Integrys possesses its own ARES certificate which it obtained from this Commission on July 6, 2005 in Docket No. 05-0319. Upon assumption of the customer contracts by Integrys on September 24, 2014, Integrys assumed full responsibility for serving those customers.
5. As a result of the above, DTES either assigned to Integrys, or did not renew contracts of its nonresidential customers. DTES had the right to not renew those contracts upon expiration, and the process it followed to do so was set forth in its contracts and has been followed properly. Those customers are now being served by another ARES or are receiving service from Ameren Companies or Commonwealth Edison Company.
6. DTES entered into a financial arrangement to meet the Commission's requirements in 83 IAC 551, including a surety bond pursuant to 83 IAC

551.50. DTES seeks to terminate the surety bond upon the withdrawal of its ARES certificate.

WHEREFORE, DTES requests that the Commission enter an order withdrawing the Certificate authorizing DTES to provide service as an Alternative Retail Electricity Supplier and permitting DTES to terminate the surety bond.
