**SUBJECT:** Illinois-American Water Company

Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Provide Water and Sanitary Sewer Service to Certain Areas in DuPage County, Illinois, pursuant to Section 8-406(e) of the Illinois Public Utilities Act

**RECOMMENDATION:** Grant the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity.

---

On August 29, 2014 Illinois-American Water Company ("Applicant" or "IAWC") filed with the Illinois Commerce Commission ("Commission"), a verified petition for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity pursuant to Section 8-406 of the Public Utilities Act ("Act"), to provide water service and sanitary sewer collection and disposal service to certain areas in DuPage County, Illinois. This matter came on for evidentiary hearing before a duly authorized Administrative Law Judge of the Commission on March 17, 2015. The matter was marked "Heard and Taken" that same day. On April 6, 2015, Applicant filed an Agreed Draft Order on the Commission's eDocket system that had been reviewed by Staff, and to which Staff did not object.

IAWC has demonstrated a need for water service in the proposed area, and that the extension and service to the area are necessary to provide adequate, reliable, and efficient service and is the least-cost means of satisfying the service needs of customers within the meaning of Section 8-406(b) of the Act. Further, because no new construction is proposed, the requirement that IAWC demonstrate it is capable of financing the proposed construction without significant adverse financial consequences for the utility or its customers has been satisfied.

Accordingly, I recommend entry of the attached Order.
