**PROPOSED PLAN MODIFICATION TO CREATE A
JOINT EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD**

The Williamson County Board of Commissioners, the Marion City Council and the Herrin City Council request approval from the Illinois Commerce Commission to combine the current Joint Williamson County Emergency Telephone System Board with the Marion Emergency Telephone system Board to create a county-wide Joint ETSB under terms of 50 ILCS 750. Each entity approved an inter-governmental agreement to create the new board the week of August 10th. That is included with this plan along with the ordinance that the Marion City Council approved for the same purpose. The Marion Council and the Williamson County Board will each vote to rescind the old ETSB's authority once the I.C.C. approves this plan.

The Williamson County Emergency Telephone System Board was created in December 1993 and was amended in 2010 to form a Joint ETSB with the city of Herrin. The system went live under terms of ICC docket# 97-0336. The city of Marion chose not to implement a landline surcharge and used city funds to go live with a city 9-1-1 system in 1994 under docket # 94-0175. Marion formed its own Emergency Telephone System Board after passage of the state wireless surcharge legislation. The two systems reached an agreement in 2012 for the Sheriff's PSAP to back up the Marion Police PSAP. This included the elimination of Marion Fire Department secondary PSAP. The Williamson County and Marion ETSBs both filed plan modifications in 2014 to change service providers from Frontier to NG911-Inc. and to participate in a 13 county regional next-generation 9-1-1 system. The two ETSBs currently share ownership of data center equipment but currently operate and will continue to operate their own PSAP(s).

A Petition to Modify the existing systems by eliminating the old ETSBs and creating a new Joint ETSB to oversee 9-1-1 operations countywide is included in this filing, along with all of the accompanying documentation requested by the ICC 9-1-1 staff.

The Williamson County ETSB had oversight over the 911 operations at the Herrin Police Department and the Williamson County Sheriff's Office PSAPs. The Marion ETSB had oversight of the 911 operation at the Marion Police PSAP. That oversight will be combined for all three PSAPs under the new Joint ETSB. Dispatchers will continue to be employees of the PSAPs. Operations and backup arrangements will remain the same as when the PSAPs operated under separate boards, but a new network diagram has been provided showing all three PSAPs as part of the same system. The PSAPs will continue to answer calls from the same coverage area as before and to dispatch for the same agencies for which they have always dispatched. Existing inter-governmental agreements will remain in place.

Operationally, the creation of the Joint ETSB makes no difference, but the administrative structure and financial arrangements will change. Effective upon the approval of this plan, funds in the Marion 9-1-1 Account will be transferred to the County 911 Fund. The Marion system has always operated as a zero-sum operation with the city covering any 9-1-1 expenses that outstripped revenue. Once this plan is approved, surcharge revenue paid to the city of Marion will be deposited in the county 911 fund. Bills that had previously been paid by Marion with that surcharge money will instead be paid by the new Joint ETSB. Effective January First when the new method of collecting and distributing 911 funds in Illinois takes effect, all money collected, both wireline and wireless will go directly into the county 911 Fund. Any checks sent to the 911 Office will be taken to the treasurer for deposit. Claims formerly submitted to the Marion City Treasurer on behalf of the old Marion ETSB will instead be handled by the County 911 Coordinator, who will continue to handle claims as he did for the old County ETSB. The new Joint ETSB will work out the specifics of the new budget, providing equal treatment to all three PSAPs.

The existing county ETSB just eliminated the position of Assistant Coordinator as a cost-cutting measure in anticipation of the merger. The Joint ETSB will employ the same county coordinator and the city of Marion will employ its same city 911 coordinator. The two coordinators will cover for each other when one is unavailable.

The Joint Board will continue to provide radio system maintenance on the towers and repeaters while the individual PSAPs will provide maintenance on the equipment located at their facilities. The Joint ETSB will contribute an equal amount to each PSAP for CAD maintenance. They will continue to provide a monthly grant to each PSAP to offset training related costs and 911 CPE equipment. That amount will be determined by the Joint ETSB.

All surcharge checks will be sent directly to the county treasurer for deposit in the 911 Fund. Once this plan has been approved, the new Joint ETSB will meet to create new by-laws, elect officers, set meeting times/ dates and decide on personnel and budget priorities. ORDINANCE NUMBER 3271

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING ENTRY INTO INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT
WITH RESPECT TO A JOINT EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEMS BOARD

WHEREAS, it has been deemed by the Mayor and city Council of the City of Marion, Illinois that Joint Emergency Telephone Systems Board is necessary and proper as the State has pursuant to Public Act 99-6, dictated a requirement of only one Joint Board for Williamson County, and,

WHEREAS, an intergovernmental agreement between the City of Herrin and Williamson County is necessary to effectuate the dictates of the aforesaid act, and

WHEREAS, the other governmental entities has expressed their intent to enter into the agreement

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT NOW ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF MARION, ILLINOIS:

1. Attached to this Ordinance is the proposed Intergovernmental Agreement for the creation of a Joint Emergency Telephone Systems Board.
2. The Mayor shall execute the Agreement upon passage of this Ordinance and shall forward the document to be executed by the other governmental entities.
3. That upon the Execution of the Agreement by the City of Herrin, and the County of Williamson, the Mayor shall appoint such members to the Board as stated in the Intergovernmental Agreement.

EFFECTIVE DATE:

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in effect after passage and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE NO. 10-04-27-03
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 93-8-10-14 (AS
AMENDED) AND RESOLUTION 93-11-17-160 AUTHORIZING AN
EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM IN THE COUNTY AND
THE FORMATION OF A JOINT EMERGENCY TELEPHONE
SYSTEM BOARD BY INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, pursuant to 50 ILCS 750 et seq (hereinafter the Act) on August 10, 1993 the Williamson County Board of Commissioners (hereinafter the County) passed Ordinance 93-8-10-14 (hereinafter the Ordinance) and ,

WHEREAS, the Ordinance set up a system for providing and funding an emergency telephone system in the County if the voters of the County authorized the system by referendum after the passage of the Ordinance, and ,

WHEREAS, a referendum was held on November 2, 1993 in which the voters of Williamson County authorized the enactment and funding of the emergency telephone system , as set forth in the Ordinance, and ,

WHEREAS, as authorized in the Act the County by Resolution 93-11-17-160 (hereinafter the Resolution) on November 17 . 1993 authorized the County to enter into and Intergovernmental Agreement (hereinafter the Agreement) with the City of Herrin, Illinois to create a Joint Emergency Telephone System Board (hereinafter the Board) for the purpose of overseeing the emergency telephone system authorized by the referendum , and ,

WHEREAS, the Act has been amended since the establishment of the emergency telephone system in 1993 , and ,

WHEREAS, there are needs for resolution of some conflicts of language in the Ordinance and the Agreement and a need to bring the Agreement into accord with the current requirements of the Act, and ,

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes the Agreement to set forth the manner of appointment and powers and duties of the Board,


NOW THEREFORE IT IS ORDAINED ,by the Williamson County Board of Commissioners that the following amendments shall be made to the Ordinance:


1. That the Ordinance is amended and shall be amended so that it is in accord with any changes in the Act which have been made or will be made in the future ,
2. That the sections of the Ordinance and the Resolution concerning the appointment of members of the Board and the 7 statutory requirements set out in the Act at the time of formation of the Board (section 4 and Section 9) will be superceded and controlled by the Agreement as it currently exists or is amended.

3. That the remainder of the Ordinance and resolution shall remain in full force and effect unless further amendment is made or in the event that the Act is further amended in which event the Ordinance will become compliant with the language of the Act by addition or amendment of language to comply with changes in the statutory requirements .



**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF MARION,
THE CITY OF HERRIN, AND THE COUNTY OF WILLIAMSON, FOR CREATION
OF A JOINT EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEMS BOARD**

WHEREAS, as authorized by 50 ILCS 750 et seq (hereinafter the Act) the County of Williamson, State of Illinois, a Unit of Local Government (hereinafter the County) and the City of Herrin, State of Illinois, a Municipal Corporation (hereinafter Herrin), did on November 22, 1993, enter into an intergovernmental Agreement establishing a Joint Emergency Telephone Systems Board (hereinafter the Board), and,

WHEREAS, the City of Marion (hereinafter Marion), did on April 4, 1994 establish its own Emergency Telephone System Board, and

WHEREAS, the Act has been amended from time to time by the Illinois legislature requiring changes in the process and appointment of Board members and other matters. Most recently, pursuant to Public Act 99-6, the legislature created a mandatory requirement of only one Joint Board for Williamson County, and

WHEREAS, The County, Herrin, and Marion must comply with the law and join together to form only one Emergency Telephone System Board for Williamson County, and

WHEREAS, the Corporate authorities, being the County, Herrin, and Marion, shall provide pursuant to the Act for the manner and number of appointees to the Board, as long as there are at least 5 members appointed to the Board, and one member shall be a member of the County Board of Williamson County, one member shall be a public member who is a resident of the local exchange service territory included in the 9-1-1 coverage area, and the other members shall be representatives of 9-1-1 public safety agencies (as defined by the Act) within the 9-1-1 coverage area and who participate in emergency 9-1-1 services, including but not limited to, police departments, fire departments, emergency medical services providers, and emergency services and disaster agencies, and appointed on the basis of their ability or experience, and,

WHEREAS, the Corporate authorities being the County, Herrin, and Marion, shall determine the powers and duties of the Board, pursuant to the Act, and this Joint Agreement shall define such powers and duties, and,

WHEREAS, Illinois Statutes (30 ILCS 15/1 et seq and 50 ILCS 310/1 et seq) require auditing of governmental entities which expend public funds and the concept of transparency of government being of extreme importance:

NOW THEREFORE IT IS AGREED,

1. That the Board will be comprised of nine (9) members.
2. That three members of the Board shall be appointed by Herrin pursuant to its rules. Two members shall be from Public Safety Agencies (as defined by the Act) within Herrin who participate in emergency 9-1-1 services and based on their ability and experience. One member shall be a public member who is a resident of the local exchange service territory as required by the Act. If at any time one of Herrin's members resigns from the Board during their term, Herrin shall appoint a new representative, based on ability and experience, within Herrin, to complete the remainder of that term. If the public member resigns, that member shall be replaced with a public member, and if a representative from the Public Safety agency resigns, that member shall be replaced by another representative from a Public Safety agency. Consideration shall first be given to a member of the Herrin Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) agency.
3. That three members of the Board shall be appointed by the County pursuant to its rules. Two members shall be from Public Safety Agencies (as defined by the Act) within Williamson County who participate in emergency 9-1-1 services and based on their ability and experience, and the remaining member shall be a County Commissioner. If at any time one of the County members resigns from the Board during their term, the County shall appoint a new member based on ability and experience to complete the remainder of the term. If a commissioner resigns, that member shall be replaced with another commissioner, and if a representative from a Public Safety Agency resigns, that member shall be replaced by another representative from a Public Safety Agency. Consideration shall first be given to a member of the County Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) Agency.
4. That three members of the Board shall be appointed by Marion pursuant to its rules. Two members shall be from Public Safety Agencies (as defined by the Act) within Marion who participate in emergency 9-1-1 services and based on their ability and experience, and the remaining member may be either a City Commissioner or another member of a Public Safety Agency. If at any time one of Marion's members resigns from the Board during their term, Marion shall appoint a new representative, based on ability and experience, to complete the remainder of the term. If a commissioner resigns, that member shall be replaced with another commissioner, and if a representative from a Public Safety agency resigns, that member shall be replaced by another representative from a Public Safety agency. Consideration shall first be given to a member of the Marion Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) agency.

5. In the event a member serving on the Board, who was appointed from a Public Safety Agency who participates in emergency 9-1-1 services, terminates their employment with the public safety agency, their appointment to the Board will also be terminated effective the same date of termination from employment with the public safety agency. The corporate authority who originally appointed that member to the Board shall appoint a new member from a Public Safety Agency (as defined by the Act) within the 9-1-1 coverage area who participates in emergency 9-1-1 services to serve the remainder of the term. If that member was appointed from a PSAP, then another person from the PSAP shall be appointed to serve the remainder of the term.

6. Members of the board shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses.

7. That all members appointed to serve on the Board shall serve 3 year staggered terms pursuant to the Act, with one third of the members terms set to expire January 1, 2016, one third set to expire January 1, 2017, and remaining Board members terms to expire January 1, 2018. Members may be reappointed at the expiration of their term. All reappointments or new appointments made thereafter will be for 3 years from the date of expiration of the previous term. The one third shall be determined as 1 member from each corporate authority.

8. That the powers and duties of the Board shall be in accord with those set out in 50 ILCS 750/15.4 as current and as amended in the future.

9. That further, the Board may create bylaws, which will become effective upon approval of a majority vote of the Board, and a copy of which shall be submitted to the Williamson County Board of Commissioner, the Herrin City Council, and the Marion City Council.


10. That the County, Herrin, and Marion being required by law to submit annual audits for any governmental entity spending funds of those governments and being responsible for establishing the powers and duties of the Board and in the interest of transparency in government, require that the Board conduct an annual audit as set forth in 50 ILCS 310 et seq.


11. Any and all funds collected for the 9-1-1 system shall be kept in the 9-1-1 Fund, which is overseen by the County Treasurer. The Board Treasurer shall work with the County Treasurer and 9-1-1 coordinator on investment of ETSB funds and payments of all 9-1-1 bills. All 9-1-1 funds currently in the possession of the City of Marion are to be combined into the fund with County and Herrin 9-1-1 funds pursuant to the joining of two former Boards into one Joint Board.

12. The Sheriff, the Herrin Police Chief, and the Marion Police Chief will continue to operate and staff their 9-1-1 dispatch PSAP centers.

13. Pursuant to 50 ILCS 750/40(b) and beginning October 1, 2016, and every October 1 thereafter, the Board shall report to the Department of State Police audited financial statements showing total revenue and expenditures for the previous fiscal year. The statements shall include a detailed summary of revenue from all sources, operating expenses, capital expenditures, cash balances, and any other financial information deemed relevant by the Department of State Police.




Dear Mr. Ramsey,

This letter is to confirm our intent to combine the former Williamson County Emergency Telephone System Board and the Marion Emergency Telephone System Board into one Joint ETSB for the purpose of overseeing a combined countywide 9-1-1 service. The existing PSAPs at the Marion Police Department, the Herrin Police Department and the Williamson County Sheriff's Office will continue to operate as they have in the past. There will be no change in the service area, no change in the way that calls are routed or answered, and no change in the existing backup arrangements. The new Joint ETSB will honor existing contracts and agreements that had been in place between the current ETSBs and NG9-1-11Inc, including the SSP contract, the ECRF/LFV agreement and the maintenance agreement through Counties of Southern Illinois. Contract negotiations regarding changes needed as the result of the new state law will continue. The creation of the Joint ETSB will become effective once approval is granted by the Illinois Commerce Commission.


Enclosed is a copy of the modification plans submitted by the Marion and Williamson County ETSBs.




