## Modification Narrative Statement

The Village of Barrington Hills has entered into an intergovernmental agreement with QuadCom Regional Communications in Carpentersville (Kane County) to provide 9-1-1 call answering and the dispatch of public safety communication services. The QuadCom PSAP, which operates under the ICC Certification #91-0187, will receive all Barrington Hills 9-1-1 calls for service and dispatch those calls which require a law enforcement response from the Barrington Hills Police Department. On calls that require a fire or EMS response the QuadCom PSAP will also dispatch those intended for the East Dundee Fire Department and Carpentersville Fire Department, and will transfer the 9-1-1 caller to the SEECOM PSAP or Cencom PSAP where fire/EMS calls for service are dispatched for the Algonquin-Lake In The Hills, Barrington & Countryside, and Fox River Grove Fire Departments. The current Barrington Hills PSAP located at the Barrington Hills Police Department, 112 Algonquin Road, in Barrington Hills will be closed effective October 27, 2015.

Upon the decommissioning of the Barrington Hills PSAP the Barrington Hills ETSB will dissolve. Barrington Hills will become a member of the QuadCom Joint Emergency Telephone Board. Both modifications requested herein are intended to become in compliance with State of Illinois Public Act #98-0006.

The Village of Barrington Hills and the QuadCom PSAP are both entirely served by the AT&T telco. Wireline 9-1-1 calls from Barrington Hills will be routed on AT&T's Geneva router trunks to QuadCom. AT&T has advised that the trunks already installed at QuadCom are adequate to handle the additional wireline call volume from Barrington Hills. Wireless 9-1-1 calls will be routed on AT&T's Lombard router trunks. AT&T will install two (2) new Lombard trunks at QuadCom to handle the wireless call volume from Barrington Hills. The CPE at QuadCom has ample capacity to add these new trunks at all answering positions.

The back-up PSAP for QuadCom is their unstaffed back-up PSAP located at 100 Carrington Drive at West Dundee Fire Station #2. During the lapse in time it takes to relocate staff to the back-up PSAP, the City of Elgin PSAP has agreed to take overflow and back-up calls for QuadCom. Both PSAPs will have Lombard and Geneva 9-1-1 trunks capable of taking wireline and wireless 9-1-1 calls in the event the service is disrupted at the QuadCom PSAP. The Barrington Hills PSAP that currently serves Cencom for back-up and overflow will no longer provide that service as of October 27, 2015. Both the QuadCom PSAP (Certification # 91-0187) and the Elgin PSAP (Certification #90-0096) meet ICC Part 725 requirements.

Dear Mr. Hunter:


This letter is to confirm our intent to close the E9-1-1 PSAP for the Village of Barrington Hills in order to consolidate 9-1-1 services with the QuadCom PSAP located in Carpentersville. In addition it is our desire to change the back-up and overflow PSAP for Barrington Hills to follow the current overflow and back-up routing established for QuadCom at its EOC located at West Dundee Fire Station #2 with an interim location at the City of Elgin PSAP. Since the Barrington Hills PSAP will be decommissioned, the overflow and back-up PSAP for the Village of Barrington (wireline 9-1-1 trunks) from the Cencom PSAP in Round Lake Beach will require changing from the Barrington Hills PSAP to the Lake Zurich PSAP.

We assume, unless otherwise notified, that the Barrington Hills E9-1-1 telephone system modifications indicated above will be in operation starting with a 9:00 AM cut-over to QuadCom on October 27, 2015.

Enclosed is a copy of our application to the Illinois Commerce Commission seeking their approval to modify our 9-1-1 plan to include the aforementioned modifications.

**AN ORDINANCE DISSOLVING THE EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS AND AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS' MEMBERSHIP IN A JOINT EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD FOR THE PURPOSE OF TRANSITIONING VILLAGE EMERGENCY DISPATCH SERVICES TO QUADCOM**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Barrington Hills (the "Village") is a home-rule municipality pursuant to Article VII, Section 6, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such is authorized to take all reasonable action pertaining to its affairs in accordance therewith; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village has established an Emergency Telephone System Board ("ETSB") pursuant to section 15.4 of the Emergency Telephone System Act and as set forth in Title 2, Chapter 5 of the Village Code; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 30, 2015 the Village Board authorized the transition of its emergency dispatch services to QuadCom which is a multi-jurisdiction Police/Fire/9-1-1 Dispatch Center and to take all necessary steps to apply to QuadCom for membership and to execute all documents necessary to allow QuadCom to provide police dispatch services to the Village, and upon acceptance by QuadCom, to undertake all other necessary and appropriate steps to properly outsource the Village's dispatch services; and

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary requirement for membership in QuadCom that the Village dissolve its ETSB and that the Village join a Joint Emergency Telephone System Board ("JETSBS") that consists of other member public entities of QuadCom; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board has determined that it is in the best interests of the Village to dissolve the Village's ETSB and to join the JETSBS which is comprised of member entities of QuadCom to further the Village's interests in transitioning its emergency dispatch services to QuadCom.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills, a home-rule community, located in the Counties of Cook, Kane, Lake and McHenry, Illinois, as follows:

**SECTION ONE:** The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

**SECTION TWO:** The Village's ESTB is hereby dissolved and Title 2, Chapter 5 of the Village Code is repealed in its entirety and reserved, **effective 12:00 a.m. on October 31, 2015**, and the Village President, the Village Chief of Police and/or the Village Administrator are authorized to take all steps necessary, including the execution of all documents related to the Village's proper dissolution of the Village's ETSB.

**SECTION THREE:** The Village is authorized to join the JETSBS, which is comprised of member entities of QuadCom, to enable the Village's transition of its emergency dispatch

services to QuadCom and the Village President and the Village Chief of Police and/or the Village Administrator are authorized to take all steps necessary, including the execution of all documents related to the Village's transition of its emergency dispatch services to QuadCom and to facilitate the Village's membership in the JETSB.

SECTION FOUR: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication in pamphlet form in the manner provided by law.



**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING MEMBERSHIP  
IN THE QUADCOM PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATION SYSTEM  
FOR PROVISION OF 911 DISPATCH SERVICE**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Barrington Hills ("Village") is a Home Rule Municipality pursuant to Article VII, Section 6, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such is authorized to take all reasonable action pertaining to its affairs in accordance therewith; and

**WHEREAS**, on the Village has recently studied the issue of out-sourcing its police dispatch services by becoming a member of QuadCom 911 Police and Fire Communications System of Carpentersville, Illinois ("QuadCom") for such services; and

**WHEREAS**, QuadCom is a public intergovernmental agency duly organized under the laws of the State of Illinois and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act; and

**WHEREAS**, QuadCom is a multi-jurisdiction Police/Fire/9-1-1 Dispatch Center that provides emergency communications to several police and fire departments in northern Kane and Cook Counties; and

**WHEREAS**, by its membership in QuadCom, the Village agrees to comply with all of the policies of the QuadCom Board of Directors and, upon securing QuadCom services, to pay its share of the budget of QuadCom as determined by the Board of Directors from time to time. For this purpose, the Village shall have no responsibility to pay any amounts to QuadCom associated with a determination of liability for QuadCom arising from Case No. 10 L 143, *Gloria Lopez v. Village of Carpentersville, et al.* presently pending in the Circuit Court of Kane County.

**WHEREAS**, at this time, the President and Board of Trustees has determined that such outsourcing can be cost effective for the Village and its residents, while retaining the quality of present dispatch services, and for this reason deems it necessary and proper to apply to QuadCom for membership, and join the intergovernmental agency for purposes of provision of dispatch services for the Village.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills, as a Home Rule Municipality, located in the Counties of Cook, Kane, Lake and McHenry, Illinois, as follows:

**SECTION ONE:** The recitals set forth above are found to be true and incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

**SECTION TWO:** The Village Administrator and/or Police Chief are authorized to take all necessary steps to apply to QuadCom for membership to execute all documents necessary to allow QuadCom to provide police dispatch services to the Village, and upon acceptance by QuadCom, to undertake all other necessary and appropriate steps to properly outsource the Village's dispatch services.

**SECTION THREE:** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval as provided by law.




LETTER OF AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT made and entered into this 28<sup>TH</sup> day of SEPTEMBER, 2015 by and between the QuadCom Joint Emergency Telephone System Board (hereinafter referred to as QuadCom JETSB) and the Village of Barrington Hills for the purpose of the QuadCom JETSB providing E-911 service to the Village of Barrington Hills.

1. The Village of Barrington Hills ETSB will be dissolved effective midnight October 31, 2015 and the Village of Barrington Hills will become a member of the QuadCom JETSB effective November 1, 2015.
2. The QuadCom JETSB agrees to pay the Village of Barrington Hills the difference of the landline surcharge collected for the Village of Barrington Hills of \$1.50 per connection from the \$.63 collected from the other members of the QuadCom JETSB from November 1, 2015 to December 31, 2015.
3. The QuadCom JETSB agrees to provide all E-911 services to the Village Barrington Hills including the receipt and processing of 911 calls and the dispatch and or transfer of those calls to the appropriate agency or entity.
4. Both parties agree that the terms of this agreement are governed by the terms of the applicable Illinois statutes and Illinois Commerce Commission (I.C.C.) tariffs.
5. The Village of Barrington Hills will be represented on the QuadCom JETSB and shall have all the rights and powers of the other members of the QuadCom Joint Emergency Telephone System.
6. This agreement shall be made a part of the amendment to the September, 2015 I.C.C. filing and shall be approved by the I.C.C. as part of the process of granting amended authority to the QuadCom JETSB to operate a E-911 system.

QUADCOM 9-1-1 SYSTEM

AMENDED

INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT  
TO ESTABLISH A JOINT EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD  
DATED JULY 20, 1989.

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into on the effective date specified hereafter, by and between the municipalities signatory hereto and also those which may hereafter become signatory:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the signatories have determined that the implementation of an enhanced 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone System would provide a significant public safety benefit to the citizens of each of the participating municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the signatories have determined that the Joint Emergency Telephone System would be beneficial on an individual and mutual basis, and

WHEREAS, Chapter 134, Paragraph 45.4 of the Illinois Revised Statutes permits the formation of the Joint Emergency Telephone System Board to oversee the implementation and operation of a 9-1-1 emergency telephone system, and

WHEREAS, Chapter 127, Section 741 of the Illinois Revised Statutes provides for the joint exercise by two or more local governments of any power common to them:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

1. Venture Established. Pursuant to Article VII, Section 10 of the 1970 Constitution and Chapter 127, Section 741 of the Illinois Revised Statutes, the undersigned have entered into an intergovernmental agreement to establish a public safety communications system including a 9-1-1 emergency telephone system. (QuadCom Public Safety Communications System Agreement, 11/87)
2. Joint Emergency Telephone System Board. The parties hereto agree to establish a Joint Emergency Telephone System Board pursuant to Chapter 134, Paragraph 45.4 of the Illinois Revised Statutes. The Joint Emergency Telephone System Board shall be made up of those individuals who serve on the QuadCom Board of Directors. Any subsequent participating municipality or fire protection district in the QuadCom Central Dispatch System shall be entitled to representation of the Joint Emergency Telephone System in a manner designated in the QuadCom Intergovernmental Agreement.
3. By-Laws. The Joint Emergency Telephone System Board shall be subject to and shall be governed by certain By-Laws, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and by this reference made a part of this Agreement, together with any amendments which may be made to said By-Laws in the manner and means therein set forth.
4. Participation. The Joint Emergency Telephone System Board shall have the authority to adopt such By-Laws as are necessary for the operation of the Board.

5. Termination. Any party to this Agreement may cease to be a party hereto and may withdraw from participation in the manner and means set forth in the By-Laws.

6. Powers of the Board. The powers and duties of the Emergency Telephone System Board created by this Agreement shall include, but not be limited to the following:

- A. Planning a 9-1-1 emergency telephone system.
- B. Coordinating and supervising the implementation, upgrading, maintenance and operation of the system including the establishment of equipment specifications and coding systems.
- C. Receiving monies from the surcharge imposed under Section 15.3 of the Emergency Telephone System Act, and from any other source, for deposit into the Emergency Telephone System Fund.
- D. Authorizing all disbursements from the fund including the repayment of any monies advanced for the planning and implementation of the system.
- E. Hiring, on a temporary basis, any staff necessary for the implementation or upgrade of the system.
- F. Making and entering into contracts.
- G. Acquiring, holding and disposing of property.
- H. Incurring debts, liabilities or obligations necessary for the accomplishment of its purposes.

7. Amendment. This Agreement may not be amended, except by written agreement and resolution of all the then current parties thereto.

8. Duration. This Agreement shall continue in effect until rescinded by unanimous consent of the current parties.

9. Enforcement. Each member shall have the right to enforce this Agreement against any other member. If suit is necessary, a defaulting member shall pay reasonable attorney's fees as adjudicated by the Court.

10. Effective Date. This Agreement shall become effective when signed by all respective representatives of the Village of Carpentersville, the Village of East Dundee, the Village of West Dundee, the Village of Sleepy Hollow and the Village of South Barrington.

**QUADCOM PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM  
INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT**

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into on the effective date hereinafter set forth, by and between the local governmental units signatory hereto and also those which may hereinafter become signatory hereto:

**WITNESSETH:**

WHEREAS, the signatories hereto have determined that there is a need by local governments within Northern Kane County, Illinois, Northern Cook County Illinois, Southern McHenry County Illinois, and Southern Lake County Illinois for a centralized public safety communications system; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by such signatories that public safety communications is of value on an individual and mutual basis; and

WHEREAS, a centralized public safety communications system can adequately serve the needs of all of such signatories; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10 of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, IL. Rev. Stat, (1989) ch.127,741, et.seq., authorize the joint exercise by two or more local governmental units of any power common to them; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the signatories hereto to jointly provide for and maintain a centralized public safety communications system for their mutual advantage and concern;

NOW, THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PROMISES, THE MUTUAL ADVANTAGES TO BE DERIVED THEREFROM AND IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL CONENANTS HEREIN CONTAINED, IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

1. Public Agency Established. Pursuant to the joint powers authorization of ARTICLE VII, Section 10 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, the undersigned do hereby join together to establish a public agency for the joint and mutual operation of a centralized public safety communications system, to be known as QuadCom which shall consist of all of the local governments signatory hereto and also those local governments which may hereinafter become signatory hereto.

2. By-Laws. QuadCom shall be subject to and shall be subject to and shall be governed by certain By-Laws, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and by this reference made a part of this Agreement, together with any amendments which may be made to said By-Laws in the manner and means set forth.

3. QuadCom Participation. Each local governmental unit signing this joint public safety communications system agreement and each local governmental unit which may hereafter sign, after approval as required by the By-Laws, is a member of QuadCom and is entitled to the rights and privileges and is subject to all obligations of membership, all as provided in said By-Laws.

4. Termination. Any party to this Agreement may cause to be a party hereto and may withdraw from participation in QuadCom in the manner and means set forth in said By-Laws.

5. Powers of the System. QuadCom shall have the power in its own name, to make and enter into contracts, to employ agents and employees, to acquire, hold and dispose of property, real and personal, to sue in its own name or with the consent of a member or members and to incur debts, liabilities or obligations necessary for the accomplishment of its purposes, but no such contract, employment, purchase, debt, liability, or obligation shall be binding upon or

obligate any member except as authorized by the attached By-Laws. QuadCom shall not have the power of eminent domain or the power to levy taxes.

6. Organizational Structure, QuadCom will be managed by a Board of Directors, Executive Committee and a Director. The powers and duties of each are set forth and defined in the attached By-Laws.

7. Employees, The number and the job descriptions of persons employed by QuadCom shall be determined by its Board of Directors. For the purposes of obtaining fringe benefits, such as insurance and retirement benefits, QuadCom personnel shall be considered employees of one of the member municipalities to this agreement.

The QuadCom Board of Directors shall determine the extent and type of fringe benefits available for QuadCom employees. The full cost of these benefits, including reasonable administrative expenses approved by the QuadCom Board of Directors, shall be borne by QuadCom.

8. Financing, QuadCom will be funded by contributions from participating units of local government. A cost sharing formula sufficient to provide the funds required by the annual QuadCom budget shall be fixed by a unanimous vote of the Board of Directors.

9. Amendment, This Agreement may not be amended, except by written agreement and resolution of all the then parties to it, provided, however, the By-Laws attached hereto as Exhibit "A" may be amended from time to time by the method and means provided herein.

10. Duration, This Agreement and QuadCom shall continue in effect until rescinded by consent of three-fourths ( ) of the then parties or until terminated in the manner provided in said By-Laws. Upon such termination, the assets remaining shall be disposed of in the manner set forth in said By-Laws.

11. Resolution Authorizing, Prior to execution of this Agreement, each member shall deliver to the other a certified copy of a Resolution authorizing and directing the execution of this Agreement.

12. Enforcement, Each member shall have the right to enforce this Agreement against any other member. If suit is necessary therefor, a defaulting member shall pay reasonable attorney's fees and costs to the prevailing party as adjudicated by the Court.


13. Effective Date, This Agreement shall become effective when signed by all of the respective representatives of the local governments signatory hereto.

14. Severability, If any part of this Agreement is adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Agreement as a whole or of any other part.


15. Notices, All notices required by this Agreement and the attached By-Laws shall be in writing. Any notice required hereunder shall be deemed to be given on the date of mailing if sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the address or addresses of the parties following their signatures at the end of this Agreement.
