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1 JUDGE RILEY: Pursuant to the direction of the
2 Illinois Commerce Commission, I now call Docket
3 02-0350. This is a complaint by Christopher B.
4 Wilson v. Commonwealth Edison Company as to billing
5 in Schaumburg, Illinois.

6 And Counsel for the respondent, would you enter
7 an appearance for the record, please.

8 MS. FRANCO-FEINBERG: On behalf of Commonwealth
9 Edison Company, Felicia Franco-Feinberg, Exelon
10 Business Services, 10 South Dearborn, Floor 35,
11 Chicago, Illinois 60603.

12 JUDGE RILEY: And, Mr. Wilson, you're
13 conducting yourself pro se again?

14 MR. WILSON: Yes, sir. It's Christopher B.
15 Wilson, pro se.

16 JUDGE RILEY: And your address, please.

17 MR. WILSON: 1116 Hampton Harbor Road. That's
18 in Schaumburg, Illinois 60193.

19 JUDGE RILEY: Thank you.

20 And we just had a brief off-the-record
21 discussion. And the parties have indicated to me
22 that this matter can be resolved given enough time.

1 It has been suggested that we continue this
2 matter for another 30 to 45 days and that will give
3 the parties the time they need to exchange whatever
4 information, correspondence, whatever, to reach an
5 accord. Is that essentially correct?

6 MS. FRANCO-FEINBERG: That's correct, your
7 Honor.

8 JUDGE RILEY: And, Mr. Wilson, do you
9 understand that as being essentially correct?

10 MR. WILSON: Yes, your Honor.

11 JUDGE RILEY: All right.

12 What we have agreed upon then is to move this
13 matter to beyond Labor Day 2002 to the date of
14 September 10 at 11:00 a.m. And that will be for
15 another status.

16 And it is anticipated, based upon the parties'
17 remarks that we may not have to convene at all at
18 that time, that this matter will be resolved prior
19 to that.

20 MS. FRANCO-FEINBERG: That's correct, your
21 Honor.

22 JUDGE RILEY: In the event that that is the

1 case, please notify the Commission at once. And
2 that will be noticed to me and then we can dismiss
3 it.

4 But, again, we have the 45 -- approximately 45
5 days so the parties have the time to work out
6 whatever they need to work out.

7 Is there anything further from Commonwealth
8 Edison?

9 MS. FRANCO-FEINBERG: No, your Honor.

10 JUDGE RILEY: Okay.

11 Mr. Wilson, did you have anything further?

12 MR. WILSON: No, sir.

13 JUDGE RILEY: All right.

14 This matter is continued to September 10 at
15 11:00 a.m. for status. Thank you very much.

16 MS. FRANCO-FEINBERG: Thank you.

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1 MR. WILSON: Thank you, your Honor. Appreciate
2 your time.
