

INTER/GOVERMENTAL AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN  
MACOUPIN COUNTY EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD  
AND  
MONTGOMERY COUNTY EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD

This agreement is hereby entered into by Macoupin County, Illinois Enhanced Emergency Telephone System Board, hereinafter referred to as "Macoupin County ETSB" and the Montgomery County, Illinois Enhanced Emergency Telephone System, hereinafter referred to as "Montgomery County ETSB" for the purpose of effectively handling 9-1-1 emergency calls in the event of an isolation in telephone service in those areas where both Macoupin County and Montgomery County residents are served by a common telephone exchange.

In the event of an isolation in telephone service, Macoupin County ETSB hereby agrees to accept calls for emergency services for the Verizon (Virden 217-965, Girard 217-627) and Citizens (Mt. Olive 217-999) exchanges.

Macoupin County ETSB shall provide experienced emergency services personnel to be stationed at the designated emergency call box at the Verizon (Virden 217-965, Girard 217-627) and Citizens (Mt. Olive 217-999) telephone exchanges when an outage has occurred. All calls of an emergency nature originating from within Macoupin County boundaries shall be handled as described within Macoupin County ETSB Policy.

All calls of an emergency nature originating from within Montgomery County boundaries shall be forwarded from the call box location to Montgomery County via the most direct means possible.

Macoupin County emergency services personnel shall remain at the emergency call box throughout the duration of the isolation.

In the event of an isolation in telephone service, Montgomery County ETSB hereby agrees to accept calls for emergency services for the Illinois Consolidated Telephone Company (Farmersville 217-227, Raymond 217-229 and Litchfield 217-324) telephone exchanges when an outage has occurred. All calls of an emergency nature originating from within Montgomery County boundaries shall be handled as described within the Montgomery County ETSB Policy.

All calls of an emergency nature originating from within Macoupin County boundaries shall be forwarded from the call box location to Macoupin County PSAP via the most direct means possible.

Montgomery County emergency services personnel shall remain at the emergency call box throughout the duration of the isolation.

Legislative intent is that 9-1-1 be used for emergency calls only. Therefore, all calls of an administrative or non-emergency nature shall be referred to the appropriate agency's published telephone number.

Macoupin County ETSB and Montgomery County ETSB agree to keep all records, times and places of all calls. All records will be available to all participants of the appropriate 9-1-1 System. It shall be the responsibility of the responding agency to maintain the report of calls and the disposition of all calls received.

All agreements, management, records and services regarding the above defined exchange of customers will be the responsibility of Macoupin County ETSB and Montgomery County ETSB.

The Macoupin County Emergency Telephone System Board and the Montgomery County Emergency Telephone System Board must approve any agreement or changes to this agreement.

## CONTRACT FOR COOPERATIVE 9-1-1 SERVICE

Between the County of Macoupin  
and the County of Montgomery, both in the State of Illinois

This agreement, made and entered into this 31 day of December, 1999, pursuant to authority of the Illinois Constitution and State Statutes, by and between the County of Macoupin hereinafter sometimes referred to as Macoupin County, and the County of Montgomery, hereinafter sometimes referred to as Montgomery County.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970 provides that units of local government may contract or otherwise associate among themselves to obtain or share services and to exercise, combine, or transfer any power of function in any manner not prohibited by law or by ordinance and may use their credit, revenues, and other resources to pay costs related to intergovernmental activities and Chapter 127, Ill. Rev. Stat., Paragraphs 74-1748, further authorizes intergovernmental cooperation, and.

WHEREAS, the Illinois Legislature recognizes that it was in the public interest to shorten the time required for a person to request and receive emergency aid and enacted the Emergency Telephone System Act, the purpose of which is to establish the number "9-1-1" as the primary emergency telephone number for use in this State and to encourage units of local government and combinations of such units to develop and improve emergency communications procedures and facilities in such a manner as to be able to quickly respond to any person calling the telephone number "9-1-1" seeking police, fire, medical, rescue and other emergency services, and

WHEREAS, the cost attendant with providing cost effective "9-1-1" services to those persons within Macoupin County, but served by a telephone exchange which is based in Montgomery County is impractical and prohibitive without intergovernmental cooperation between the counties, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the corporate authorities of the County of Macoupin and the County of Montgomery, respectively, that this agreement is in the best interest of each of the signatory counties:

NOW THEREFORE,

1. Montgomery County through its Emergency Telephone System Board shall file a petition to obtain approval of a Final "9-1-1" emergency reporting system to serve Macoupin County with the Illinois Commerce Commission.
2. Montgomery County agrees to provide the following services to Macoupin County through its Emergency Telephone Systems Board.

A. The Montgomery County PSAP shall answer "9-1-1" calls from Macoupin County residents served by the exchanges of :

Farmersville (217) 227	approximately 40 access lines
Raymond (217) 229	no access lines
Litchfield (217) 324	approximately 125 access lines


and the caller's information shall be relayed to the Macoupin County PSAP via:  
Primary: Telephone (217) 854-2131 or (217) 854-3135

B. Both Macoupin County and Montgomery County agree not to discriminate as between calls for 9-1-1 service from within Macoupin County or Montgomery County. All calls will be handled in accordance with established PSAP operating procedures with no preference being given to calls originating in either county. There will be no exchange of surcharge funds in this intergovernmental agreement.

3. The terms of this contract shall be in effect from the date of execution thereof and shall be reviewed annually thereafter.

4. This agreement may be terminated by either party upon sixty (60) days written notice to the other party.
